- 13. ____ I am not personally responsible for the policies of racist institutions.
- 14. ____ The most important things minorities need are an education and the vote.
- 15. ____ (White) people would not have to integrate if they don't want to.
- 16. ____ Love can't be legislated.
- 17. ____ What are we going to do to alleviate the Black problem?
- 18. ____ Every person should be judged solely on the basis of his or her accomplishments, regardless of race.
- 19. ____ We (Whites) should get a little more appreciation for what we are doing to help.
- 20. ____ Some of my best friends are Black.

- 21. ____ (Said to a Black person) I've gotten to know you so well that I just don't see you as Black anymore.
- 22. ____ Every time I express my opinion to a Black person, I get put down.
- 23. ____On the basis of statistics, it's true that there is a higher crime rate in the ghetto.
- 24. ____Black people are more in tune with their feelings; they are more emotional.
- 25. ____ In many situations, minorities are paranoid and oversensitive. They read more into the situation than is really there. They find discrimination because they are always looking for it.
- 26. ____ Why don't they just relax.
