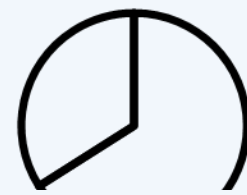
Overview of enrollments in Dual Credit in the Qualicum School District

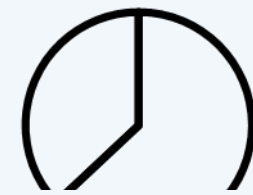

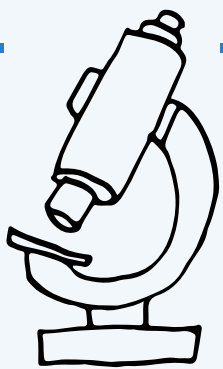

Most Dual Credit graduates in the Qualicum School District will continue to pursue further education once they have finished their program.

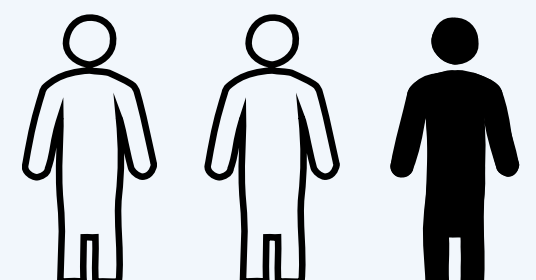

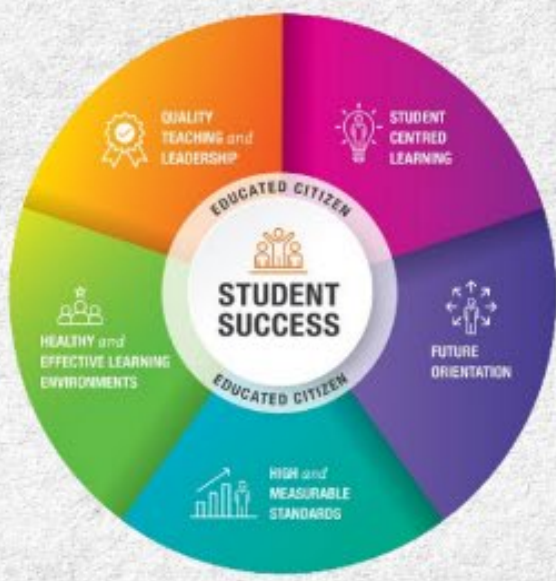

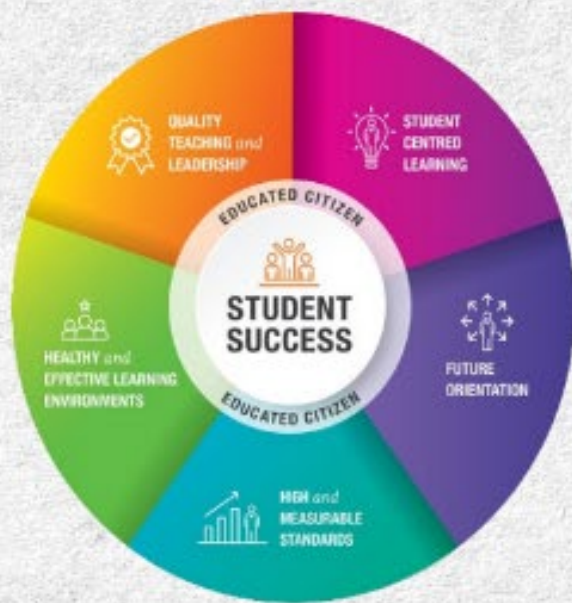
