Staff Presentation

Transportation Update: Brant from the district talked about new software for student transportation will roll out in stages from March 2024 to March 2025, including GPS, tablets, and a parent communication app. The system aims to improve route planning, safety, and efficiency, with cost savings expected over time. Parent communication app for route information and alerts. Impact to date: Reduced number of bus stops. Decreased bus operation hours. No options for kids to change routes if they need to go to a different place after school. Only registered busing students can use the system.

Emergency Supplies: The district is working on replenishing emergency supplies, addressing moisture issues, and adhering to best practices within budget. Sea cans (shipping containers) used for storage at various schools. Supplies in varying states of readiness across the district. Some issues with moisture and mold in sea cans. District responsibilities: No specific mandate for extensive emergency supplies. First aid supplies required by regulations. Current supplies exceed minimum requirements. It is up to each school what to supply. District working on replenishing perishables with long-life supplies and adding bags to control moisture. They are addressing key and lock standardization for better access. Funding and support: District committed to maintaining sea can kits but some PACs involved in restocking food and water as there is limited funds available for extensive updates Best practices: Emergency preparedness organizations recommend supplies for earthquake-prone areas.

PAC Insurance

PAC's are not named as additional insured but are covered under the district approved dpac / pac sponsored events. BC school protection program.

Feeding Futures

Funding is distributed accordingly. Presentation to the Education Committee should be in the report.

Discussion on Pride flag policy, with no need for a specific policy as inclusion is already covered. Pride flag policy discussion: Trustee advised against implementing a specific Pride flag policy as they believe existing safe and caring schools policy supports inclusion. Schools already engage in various diversity initiatives and celebrations. All secondary schools have two flagpoles to accommodate Pride and Indigenous flags. Elementary schools display Pride symbols or flags in various ways

Trustee time commitments vary. Approximate time commitment ranges from 5 to 15 hours include meetings, paperwork, committee work, and school visits. Time may increase during negotiation years or for trustees on specific committees.
