- 5) School Updates:
 - a) École Secondaire Ballenas Secondary School
 - We have feedback that we want an enriched French program. Seeking to increase the % of French Immersion course offerings; Ministry recommends 50-75% in Gr. 10; increase Social Studies offerings, possibilities of adding PHE and Career Ed; question about is there enough French language practice in PHE?; will need another French Immersion course offering in Grade 12 20th Century World History 12
 - Cultural exchanges can be used towards a FI course credits as well. Another option
 is adding more science/math offerings, however if can be difficult to find a Frenchspeaking specialist teacher for this option.
 - Feb. 15th parent information night and Open House

b) École Oceanside Elementary School

- Gr. 6/7 students completed our FI Student Survey it was a bit difficult for some of them to come up with ideas/answer some of the questions; Angela will adapt for younger students.
- Program of choice registration is completed, more can continue to apply for FI and will be placed on a waitlist. There was again a strong interest in FI.
- Gr. 4-7 students are working on their speeches for Concours and we have asked Francine Frisson to join us as a judge.
- Feb. 21st is Cirque one week of French Circus for the whole school community.
- CPF is struggling to find new members locally.

- A group of teachers met to discuss our FI budget. Some highlights: we are supporting newer teachers to equip their classes, helping fund some OZBOTS, laptops, library resources, and guided reading books.
- A group of teachers are going to the BCLCA conference in Whistler.
- French book fair coming soon.
- 2 French Immersion student teachers will be doing their practicum with us this spring.

6) District Updates:

- a) Institut de Français 2-week French language program for teachers in the summer (July) at UBC
- b) Professional learning themes for Core French 5-7 The new curriculum, strategies for second language learning, resources; CPF advocates for having more Core French learning resources; workshops to be organized during the school day.
- c) FI student survey results Students seemed to take the survey seriously; Vivian shared the key themes and new ideas; see report below.
- 7) Strategies to support dual track school communities: Discussion Parents of children in the English cohort at Oceanside have expressed that they feel the English program is not promoted and that they do not always feel welcome or valued; How do we make them feel more welcome? CPF has ideas of how this is done around the province; example CPF and PAC is often combined in many schools Can CPF get more involved with the PAC? Challenge of communications some may not know what's happening in the school; we need a large Immersion population at elementary to allow for a viable secondary program creates an imbalance of student numbers between the English and French programs at EOES; question could we look at ways to expand the program in another school site?; also perception of Immersion as a promoted special valued program in the school, yet it is promoted in a similar way to other district programs of choice; possibly a late Immersion program could be considered?

Results of the SD69 French Immersion Student Learning Survey January 2020

Participation rate: 54 students in Grades 6-12

- A) ...sont les plus captivantes pour vous en tant qu'apprenant en langues? (are the most engaging for you as a language learner?)
 - Learning through speaking activities; discussion, debates, dialogues/skits, games
- Group work and projects
- Field trips
- · Reading literature, writing, grammar
- B) ...encouragent votre compréhension de la culture française au Canada et dans le monde? (encourage your understanding of French culture in Canada and the world?)
 - Movies and videos about French culture
 - Research projects
 - Quebec exchanges
 - Studying history and reading novels
- C) ...vous aident à développer vos compétences françaises orales? (help you develop your Frenchspeaking skills)
 - Discussions and conversations
 - Debates
 - Oral presentations
 - Skits
 - Reading and talking about books
 - Suggestions raised about having speaking opportunities with other native speakers (i.e. inviting guests in and visits beyond the school)
- D) ...soutiennent à la fois votre développement de langue française et d'apprentissage de tous domaines d'études? (support both your French language development and learning across all subject areas?)
 - Lots of variability in answers so themes were not readily apparent
 - Many think learning French has helped them in other subjects (i.e. helps to better understand different perspectives)
 - Some found that vocabulary was difficult when they moved from French as the language of instruction to English (i.e. Math)

- Many expressed that this is difficult unless people in the community speak French
- French book clubs
- Suggestions of French events and connecting with other FI students (French Immersion students conference, dinners, fairs, festivals)




