ADMIN MESSAGE



Health Canada virtual learning experience

This free educational program for grades 4 to 6 provides students with important information about alcohol, cannabis, tobacco and vaping products.





Alcohol, cannabis, tobacco, and vaping products can have especially harmful impacts on young people because these substances can affect the way brains develop and bodies work. This is why it's important for students to Get the Facts on these substances and to know the risks.

Get the Facts is an interactive, free, virtual program presented by two trained facilitators who will engage students with interactive activities and live Q&A sessions.

This foundational information will help younger youth build a mindset centred around healthy choices and encourage lower risk behaviors later in life.

Agenda:

- What are alcohol, cannabis, tobacco, and vaping products.
- Short and long-term effects of these substances.
- Mental health impacts of substance use & addiction.
- Tips on dealing with peer pressure.
- Available resources.

The session is:

- For grades 4 to 6.
- 45 to 60 minutes in duration.
- Available in English or French.
- Suitable for groups of up to 50 students.
