Spring and Growth

We've been enjoying the sunshine and noticing early signs that spring is just around the corner!

Many valuable learning activities have been taking place. Teachers are preparing your child(ren)'s

Learning Update(s) to send home ahead of Spring Break. Ms. MacLeod and I are looking forward to reading these documents which provide a "snapshot" of your child's learning at this point in the year. If you have any questions about the Learning Update, please reach out to your child's teacher.

In the coming months, as learning activities become progressively challenging, expectations increase, and students work towards greater independence, we sometimes see a tendency for some students to want to "give up." The article below shares strategies to help your child develop perseverance—also known as "grit."

Research shows that grit is a key factor in school success:

What do spelling champions and West Point cadets have in common? It's a quality known as grit—the ability to stick with something even when it's hard.

Current research highlights the importance of grit. People who persist when faced with challenges are more likely to be successful. Here are some ways to encourage grit in your child:

• Focus on the reward of finishing a tough task. For example, say, "You did your homework—now you can relax and enjoy yourself!"

- Encourage a habit of starting tasks promptly. People with grit don't put off unpleasant tasks.

 Try saying, "You work on your homework while I clean these drawers. Let's see how much we can finish in 15 minutes."
- Emphasize effort over ability. Success requires dedication and persistence as much as intelligence. Acknowledge every bit of hard work and each small step of progress your child makes.

Hul'q'umin'um Language

Each week on our morning announcements we include Hul'q'umin'um' words that we have been practicing. Tum xuytl is the Hul'q'umin'um word for winter and translates as "cold time". There are three salish moons that reside within this season as well as the 13th moon. Tum xuytl is the Moon of cold weather. Thulxwumucun is the Moon of shining ice. Mimne' is the Little child moon. The common loon can be found on Vancouver Island in the winter time. Xwi'kwus is the Hul'q'umin'um word for loon.

AES Parking Lot - Draft Plan


Please drive slowly and safely.






