Variety Children's Charity - Help for families

This year our PAC successfully applied and received a grant from Variety. Thanks to this recent grant, our school foyer has been transformed into a welcoming space for students to gather, and we also want to ensure families are aware of the other services Variety offers.



Variety provides significant funding to support families in need, with grants available for a wide range of services and equipment, including:

- Adaptive & mobility equipment: Up to \$4,000
- Van conversion: Up to \$7,500
- Mental wellness counselling: Up to \$2,500
- Specialized therapies: Up to \$2,500
- Autism and psychoeducational assessments: Up to \$4,000
- Tutoring bursary for learning disabilities: Up to \$1,500
- Tuition (school fees): Up to \$4,000
- Type 1 Diabetes support: Based on PharmaCare Maximum Family Deductible

Eligibility is income-tested with a net family income below \$85,000. The application process is straightforward. Please don't hesitate to reach out for supports and we can put you in touch with someone familiar with this process.

Traffic and Parking at AES

**Important* The parking lot between the school and the Kids' Club is strictly for STAFF and DAYCARE use only. AES Parking Lot - Draft Plan


