Kindergarten 2026 Registration Open January 19, 2026

Online Kindergarten registration (through MyEdBC) for the 2026-2027 school year opens on January 19, 2026. To qualify for Kindergarten enrolment in September 2026, a child must become five years of age on or before December 31, 2026.

Proof of Age for a student includes a birth certificate or passport. Check out the School District website registration page to see what else you need to know.

The District will offer a "Pre-Kindergarten" program in April and May. Incoming Kindergarten students must be registered at their catchment school in order to apply to participate in this program. If you have registered your child by Thursday, March 12th you will be sent an



application via email and those who register for Kindergarten after that date will be considered based on available space.
