We are in the season of **yuxay'tl'thut** – the time before it gets cold. The seasonal moon is **tum kwaluxw**, the *dog salmon moon*. This has been a meaningful month of learning and reflection at Arrowview.

Our students and staff came together for a thoughtful Remembrance Day ceremony, honouring the courage and sacrifices of those who served and recognizing the importance of peace in our world today.

We are recognizing Métis Week, creating space for students to learn about Métis culture, history, and the strength of the Métis Nation. Her time, knowledge, and presence are a true gift to our learners and staff.


