



### **Dogs on School Property**

For the safety and comfort of all students, staff, and families, we ask that dogs on school property be kept on a leash and under control at all times. Thank you for helping us maintain a safe and welcoming environment for everyone.





### **Literacy Screening with DIBELS**

Over the next two weeks, staff will continue to administer **DIBELS** (**Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills**) with all students. DIBELS is a *universal literacy screener*—a quick, research-based check-in that helps us understand how students

are developing foundational reading skills.

The purpose of this screening is to:

- · Identify students' strengths in early literacy skills
- Pinpoint areas where additional support may be needed
- Inform our teaching and guide small group instruction

DIBELS is not a test that students can pass or fail; rather, it provides valuable information to help us ensure that every child is on track with their reading development. If you'd like to learn more about DIBELS or how we use this information, please don't hesitate to reach out to your child's teacher.

### **Grade 6 Immunizations**

Grade 6 immunizations will be provided to students on Oct 17, 2025.



Recently, a **letter was sent home through the school from Island Health regarding consent for grade 6 immunizations**. If your child brought home a letter and you have not already done so, please

complete the online provincial digital consent tool. If you do not have access to a computer or smart phone, please contact your local public health unit at the phone number below. Please contact the local public health unit at (250)947-8242 if you have any questions, if you are submitting immunization records for your child using the digital consent tool, or if you would prefer to book an immunization appointment for your child at the health unit.

## Walk Your Wheels



A friendly reminder that for everyone's safety, students are not permitted to ride bikes, scooters, or other wheeled devices on school property. With active traffic during arrival and dismissal times, it's important that all students *dismount* once they reach school grounds and *walk their wheels* to the designated parking areas.
