

A Reminder for Parents

Dogs on School Property

For the safety and comfort of all students, staff, and families, we ask that dogs on school property be kept on a leash and under control at all times. Thank you for helping us maintain a safe and welcoming environment for everyone.





Literacy Screening with DIBELS

Over the next two weeks, our staff will be administering **DIBELS** (**Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills**) with all students. DIBELS is a *universal literacy screener*—a quick, research-based check-in that helps us understand how students

are developing foundational reading skills.

The purpose of this screening is to:

- · Identify students' strengths in early literacy skills
- Pinpoint areas where additional support may be needed
- Inform our teaching and guide small group instruction

DIBELS is not a test that students can pass or fail; rather, it provides valuable information to help us ensure that every child is on track with their reading development. If you'd like to learn more about DIBELS or how we use this information, please don't hesitate to reach out to your child's teacher.

Grade 6 Immunizations

In B.C the Human Papilloma (HPV) vaccine is recommended for all grade 6 student as part of their routine immunization schedule.

Grade 6 students may be eligible for additional vaccines if they are not up to date. A letter with instructions on providing consent for immunizations will be sent home to students shortly. Please follow



the instructions and provide consent or refusal to immunizations using the new digital consent platform.

Immunizations will be provided at the school for grade 6 students on Oct/Nov 2025. Contact the local Health Unit at (250) 947-8242 if you have any questions.

Walk Your Wheels



A friendly reminder that for everyone's safety, students are not permitted to ride bikes, scooters, or other wheeled devices on school property. With active traffic during arrival and dismissal times, it's important that all students *dismount* once they reach school grounds and *walk their wheels* to the designated parking areas. The same applies at the end of the day—students must walk their bikes or scooters off school property before riding. Thank you for helping us keep our school community safe!
