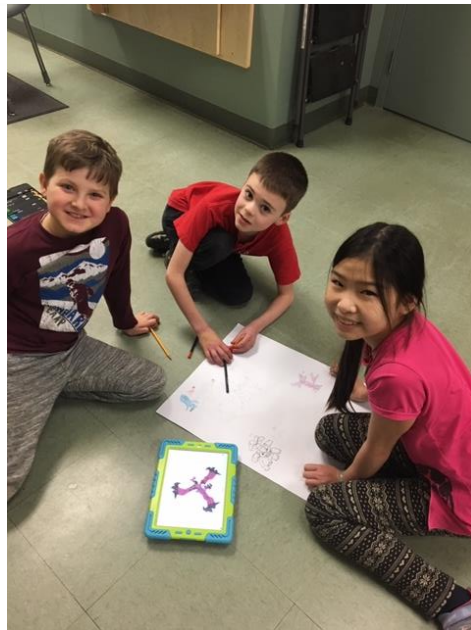

Point of Progress Reports

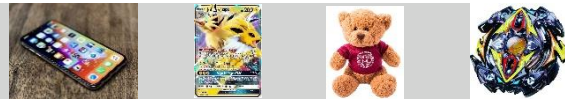
We have joined many school boards across the province in a pilot to communicate student learning to families. February 1st students will be bringing home with a Point of Progress report. Our hope is to have parents and guardians kept up to date on their students learning through a variety of methods. All teachers are using portfolios, either digital or paper based as a way to document learning throughout the year. Phone calls, conferences and meetings are all a part of this process so that we no longer have to rely on a report card only. Having multiple points of contact allow students to be more aware of their own strengths and what they need to do as a next step.

We recognize that students are learning on a continuum. Students have strengths and stretches that are unique to each learner. We are also aware that students work within a range of skills, knowledge and ability to demonstrate what they are learning. Our reports being sent home will show a small bar that makes this range more visible.

Toys, Gadgets and Electronics at School



We advise parents and students that personal belongings such as toys and games remain at home. Lost or broken toys can cause emotional stress to children, disrupt the learning environment and are not the school's responsibility to find or replace.

Specific teachers may allow these items to be brought to school for a variety of reasons. Individual students who have difficulty using any toy or gadget may have the item removed from their position. Any toys that resemble, or can be used as, weapons will be confiscated and are not to be on school property (this includes water pistols).

Electronic devices such as cameras, cell phones or tablets cannot be used on school property unless directed and supervised by a staff member. Any electronics being used shall be confiscated and returned to a parent. Please let us know if you have any questions.
