



WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING?

We recommend arriving in either a collard shirt and tie, or a scoop/v-neck shirt to be worn under your grad gown. You will also have the option of doing photos without your gown afterwards, so dress in an outfit you like and feel comfortable in. You may bring a small personal item - but it must fit in one hand.
