GRADE 9 IMMUNIZATIONS

Immunization consent packages for grade 9 students have been sent home. Follow the instructions inside the consent package and return the signed consent form to the school as soon as possible. Students in grade 9 will be offered immunizations in school-based clinics. Please discuss the information in the consent package with your child and include them in the decision to provide consent for immunization.

Students in grade 9 can make an informed decision about immunization regardless of their parent/guardian/representative decision to consent or refuse immunization. For more information visit HealthLinkBC: <u>The Infants Act, Mature Minor Consent and Immunization.</u>

QUALICUM SCHOOL DISTRICT Kindergarten Registration January 20 to January 31, 2025

Online Kindergarten registration (through MyEdBC) for the 2025-2026 school year opens on January 20 through to January 31, 2025. To qualify for Kindergarten enrolment in September 2025, a child must become five years of age on or before December 31, 2025. Proof of Age for a student includes a birth certificate or passport. PROGRAMS OF CHOICE

French Immersion – when registering your Kindergarten child on-line at their catchment school, please be sure to indicate in the notes field that you wish to apply to have your child in the French Immersion Program. Then complete the Kindergarten French Immersion application Form.

Primary Learning Community - when registering your Kindergarten child online at their catchment school, please be sure to indicate in the notes field that you wish to apply to have your child attend the Primary Learning Community Program. Then complete the Primary Learning Community application form.

CROSS BOUNDARY INFORMATION

The Board of Education believes that, in general, students should attend their catchment area school based on their home address. Transfer of a student to a school outside of their catchment area may be considered upon written application of the parent for consideration by the Associate Superintendent of Schools.

Parents wishing to request their Kindergarten child attend an out-of-catchment school within the district **MUST FIRST** register their child on-line at their catchment school, and then make their cross boundary request by completing the on-line cross boundary application form. The application process for the 2025-2026 school year will be open from January 21st until March 13th, 2025. The next opportunity to apply will be in the fourth week of August.
