MESSAGE FROM THE ADMIN TEAM

May is upon us, and if feels like the school year only speeds up the closer you get to June. Slow down, time! There's been lots happening here at BSS – here is a glimpse of what we've been up to:

- We had a fantastic day of learning together at BSS on the last Pro-D Day. The school's focus was on culture and belonging, and on social and emotional learning in our school. We spent the day with a facilitator from the The Circle Education "promotes healthy relationships in order to foster communities free of violence, bullying, discrimination, assault and abuse."
- This past week Ballenas recognized Red Dress day, which is observed on May 5th and is the National Day of awareness and remembrance for the <u>Missing and</u> <u>Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls and gender diverse</u> people (MMIWG2S)
- Ballenas will be hosting a Moosehide Walk on May 14th at 1:30 pm. <u>The Moosehide Campaign</u> is a grassroots movement of Indigenous and non-Indigenous men and
 - boys who are standing up against violence towards women and children. Wearing the moose hide pin signifies your commitment to honour, respect and protect the women and children in your life and speak out against gender-based and domestic violence

MY RIDE K-12 TRANSPORTATION WEBSITE/APP

The district is introducing a new Transportation App/Website service, **My Ride K-12** that will be the primary method of communicating bus routing information to families moving forward. This service is available via a web browser and website or via a downloadable app which includes notification features. See the Transportation section of our website for more information and an FAQ and sign up instructions.

^{*}Parents and caregivers who believe these fees will cause financial hardship in their household are encouraged to speak to their school principal about fee relief. Options may include partial or even full fee waivers, depending on need, which will then be communicated by the principal to the Transportation Department.

REGISTRATION PROCESSING TIMELINES

April – June 30 only Eligible bus pass applications will be processed, on a first come/first served basis.

- o If a bus reaches capacity, an *Eligible Rider wait list* will be created. You will be notified if you are put on a wait list.
- o Courtesy rider applications received during this time will not be processed until after July 1.
- Exact bus route information will be distributed to families before the first day of school through My Ride K-12 website and App.

July 1- onwards Courtesy, as well as late Eligible bus pass applications will be processed on a first come/first served basis as space is available on the bus route(s) requested.

- Courtesy riders that are offered a space on the bus will be notified and asked to pay the necessary fees. When payment is received the application will be finalized. If payment is not made within 5 business days of being offered the space, the application will be redated and put back into the queue.
- o If a bus reaches capacity, a wait list will be created. You will be notified if you are put on a wait list.
- Exact bus route information will be distributed to families before the first day of school through My Ride K-12 website and App.

Applications received after Sept 1 will be considered on a wait list and only accepted on a first come first served basis as space on busses allow.

PROM TICKET Pick up & TABLE SEATING Requests - May 29th & 30th @ BSS

- Prom Committee volunteers will be set up at BSS for Grads to:

- Note: YOU NEED TO HAVE YOUR GRAD FEES PAID (by May 28th) in order to pick up tickets & have your name included in the table seating (on May 29th & 30th)
- To ensure fees are paid, we invite you to *click <u>here</u> and pay them now*. (Anyone needing to discuss payment options, please contact the BSS Office)
- Guest fees can also be paid in SchoolCash online by clicking here (It will appear as an "option" item in the Grad's profile)
- o **FAQ's:**
 - There are 8 People per table
 - Yes, all People need to have paid fees to add them as a group to the table. (ie: If 8 people are wanting to sit as a group...and only 7 have paid...only the 7 will be added to a table seating, that 8th person can't be added)
 - Yes, guests will also need their fees paid to receive their ticket or be included in seat selection

2025 SUMMER EXPLORE YOUR CAREER OPTIONS

A three week summer program where students can gain valuable training/ certifications and work experience in the Trades, Health and Human Services and other certificate based industries. In the first week, students will complete Level 1 First Aid/ Food Safe/WHIMIS training, tour local post-secondary campuses- VIU and NIC, visit local industry employers, participate in WorkSafe workshops and collaborate with the Parksville Career Centre to build resumes and other employment skills. The second and third weeks, student will be placed in a work experience with local employers based on their chosen field. Through this program students will receive a 4 credit elective course and fulfill some of the requirements for the HeadStart/ Dual Credit programs.


- Eligibility: youths aged 5-18 of First Nations, Inuit, Métis, or self-declared ancestry.

Dear Parent or Guardian,

Having complete information about students' immunization status allows public health to recommend immunizations a child may be missing and improves the health authority's ability to respond during an outbreak.

The Vaccination Status Reporting Regulation (VSRR) supports health authorities to collect schoolaged children's immunization records so that all records are stored in one place: the Provincial Immunization Registry.

If you are new to British Columbia or have received immunizations in travel clinics, pharmacies or physicians' offices, your child's records may be incomplete.

The Vaccine Status Reporting Regulation applies to all students in public and independent schools within the province's jurisdiction, including students who are home-schooled and international students. The regulation does not apply to children attending schools in First Nations communities.

Island Health public health staff will be mailing letters directly to households of students for whom immunization records are missing or incomplete. If your child's record is up to date, you will not be contacted.

If you receive a letter, please update the child's records directly through the online Provincial Immunization Record Registry, or by dropping of records at your local public health unit. Schools do not collect or retain any immunization records. **Do not submit immunization records to your child's school.**
