MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As we move into fall, we welcome the crisp air and changing leaves. This is a great time for students to reflect on their progress and stay focused as we head into the second half of the semester. Regular attendance in high school is essential for student success. Being present in class ensures students receive direct instruction and personalized support from teachers. It also helps build strong connections with peers and adults, fostering a sense of belonging within the school community. At school, we expect phones to be put away during instructional time, and we ask families to reinforce these expectations at home. IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

Students have been given a lot of information during the first week of school, including several very important forms that need to be <u>completed and signed by the legal parent/guardian</u>. If you haven't already done so, please complete and return the following forms to the office as soon as possible:

- 1. Student Information Verification Printout (Yellow Paper)
- 2. Annual Update Emergency Release and Health Information (Pink Paper)

To ensure that we are compliant with Ministry of Education and Child Care procedures, we are requesting that you submit proof of British Columbia residency to ensure our files are up to date. Please email the school at ballenas@sd69.bc.ca or drop off a copy of one of the following documents to demonstrate BC residency:

- driver's license
- utility bill
- tenancy agreement/purchase agreement
- automobile insurance
- current income tax return

The document that you submit must include your current home address. This process is not related to, nor will it affect cross-boundary enrollment. It is a requirement for student funding by the British Columbia Ministry of Education and Child Care. A separate request may follow for proof of BC MSP if we do not have this on file for your child. Please disregard this request if you have recently registered (within the last 2 years) and have already provided this to us.
