OUR CALLS TO ACTION

We acknowledge our role in listening and will engage in several lessons throughout the year as a whole school to continue to build our understanding of the truth and begin to answer the TRC's Calls to Action on the path towards Reconciliation. CEAP

PROVINCIAL ASSESSMENTS

To graduate, students need to complete three Provincial Assessments (4 if they are in French Immersion). These are written at various points throughout the year:

- Literacy 10 (January and April)
- Numeracy 10 (January and April)
- Literacy 12 (January and April)
- Évaluation de littératie de la 12e année Français langue seconde immersion (LTF12) (January only)

We will be running a session during the last week of October for the following:

- Literacy 12 for students who are meeting grad requirements and finishing up in January, or who are going to a Dual Credit program in second semester
- Numeracy 10 and Literacy 10 for students in Grade 12 who have not yet written this assessment

Students will need to sign up for these assessments in the counselling office. A schedule will be prepared and sign up available later this week. A reminder that students can access practice assessments online – there is a link found on our website.

FLEX LEARNING

This is flexible time for students to receive additional support, or to explore an area of interest and passion. Grade 8s and 9s will sign up for spaces via their homerooms, and Grade 10s - 12s can self-select a learning area of their choice. Flex learning takes place each Wednesday from 8:38 – 9:48 and *learning spaces will be posted in the front foyer*. Teachers are also able to sign students up or assign students to specific spaces for support during this time.

HALLOWEEN

Halloween will soon be upon us, and we know there will be many fun filled events at Ballenas, including a costume contest. We are always amazed at the creativity that goes into costume planning and creation, and we want to take this opportunity to remind students to be thoughtful when planning their costume choices. ATTENDANCE PROCEDURES

If your student is absent for the day, please call the attendance line to let us know. If they need to leave for the day, or have an appointment, we do require a phone call to the office or attendance line, otherwise your student will be marked absent/unexcused. We do expect students to sign in/out of the office so in an emergency situation we can look at the clipboard and clarify if a student has left the building. To support students and families, Staff have been asked to call home when students reach 5 unexcused absences as we know there may be many factors behind this. When students reach 10 unexcused absences, they will be connected with their grade counsellor to further support connection to classes and school.

MY SCHOOL DAY APP

MUSIC DEPARTMENT INFO

Remembrance Day: The first thing to put on your calendars is the Remembrance Day Assembly for the Sr. Concert Band students (grades 10, 11, and 12 only) and the Choir students. My School Day

Quick Start for Students and Parents

Fall 2023

1. Download the app

You can find the app - it's free to download! - on the App Store (iOS) or Google Play (Android) by

- · Searching in the store for "My School Day"
- Going to https://myschoolday.app/download in the browser on your phone
- · Using the QR code at right.





Make sure to allow it to receive notifications when asked - the school will use them to send out important reminders, information and alerts.


2. Select your school

The first time you start the app you will need to select your school. Choose a province, school district, and finally your school from the lists provided, and tap "confirm". This only needs to be done once.

3. Follow channels.

Channels let the school administration and teachers send out information specific to your classes and activities, so you get only those notifications for your classes and those of interest to the entire school. To subscribe to channels:

- Tap on the "Classes" icon
- · Tap "Follow Channels" in the menu
- · Tap the checkboxes for the channels you are interested in
- · Tap on the "Done" button.





4. Enter your classes

Tapping on the classes icon also gives you an option to set up your timetable. Select that option and enter your class names and select colours and icons. You can also enter morning, lunch, and after school activities. When you tap on "Done", the app will fill in your timetable.

5. Access school information, links and files

The school and teachers will add links and files that provide resources to the school community such as course materials for remote learning, health advisories, and other school, district, and provincial information. To access these school-wide and channel-specific resources:

CANADIAN DENTAL CARE PLAN

As you may know, the Government of Canada announced the implementation of the new **Canadian Dental Care Plan**, as of December 18, 2023. The Canadian Dental Care Plan (CDCP) aims at reducing the costs of dental care for Canadian residents who have a family net income of less than \$90,000.

Complete details for the Canadian Dental Care Plan can be found online at **Canada.ca/dental** or by clicking **HERE**.

The implementation has been following a phased-in approach. Applications are currently open for:

- children under 18
- persons with disabilities with a valid Disability Tax Credit on file with CRA
- seniors 65+

Note: The program will expand to all eligible Canadian residents as of 2025.

Eligibility criteria – complete details

To qualify for the CDCP, you must:

- have an adjusted family net income of less than \$90,000.
- be a Canadian resident for tax purposes.
- have filed your tax return for the previous year (and received Notice of Assessment).
- not have access to dental insurance.
- NOTE: You need to meet ALL the eligibility criteria to qualify for the CDCP.

Applications – applications can be done online at <u>Canada.ca/dental</u> or over the phone with a live CDCP agent by calling 1-833-537-4342.

Coverage – <u>complete details</u>

• The proportion covered by the CDCP will depend on the adjusted family net income threshold. This is called a co-payment. The portion of the total amount that is not covered by the CDCP remains at the client's expense.

Adjusted family net income	How much will the CDCP cover	How much you will cover
Lower than \$70,000	100% of eligible oral health care service costs will be covered at the CDCP established fees.	0% of the CDCP established fees. You may face additional charges as described below.
Between \$70,000 and \$79,999	60% of eligible oral health care service costs will be covered at the CDCP established fees.	40% of the CDCP established fees. You may face additional fees as described below.
Between \$80,000 and \$89,999	40% of eligible oral health care service costs will be covered at the CDCP established fees.	60% of the CDCP established fees. You may face additional fees as described below.

Canadian Dental Care Plan: How to Apply Online

- You can apply for yourself or for someone else. If you're applying for someone else, you'll need to call in and speak to an agent.
- Before applying, make sure you and your spouse or common-law partner (if applicable) have filed your 2023 tax return and received your Notice of Assessment.

1 Gather your information

To complete the application, you will need to provide:







Date of birth





Home and mailing address



List of any dental coverage you currently have

2 Visit Canada.ca/dental and follow the steps



You will be asked for your personal information. If you have a spouse or common-law partner, you will need to provide their information as well.



Provide your phone number, alternate phone number, mailing and home address(es).



Tell us your preferred language and how you'd like to communicate with Sun Life.



Tell us if you're already covered by any other dental insurance plans.



Tell us if you have any other government dental benefits. This will not affect your eligibility.




Review your information, then click the "Submit application" button.



Keep a copy of your application. You will not receive a confirmation email.


3 Sit back and relax



To check the status of your application, use the CDCP Status Checker at Canada.ca/my dentalapplication or call 1-833-537-4342 and choose "option 2".



You will get a letter by mail with details about your eligibility and what to do next. In the future you will be able to receive notifications through My Service Canada Account (MSCA). Sign up for an account now.



If eligible, Sun Life will mail you a welcome package. It will include your coverage start date, a member card and other details.
