We would like to acknowledge that École Ballenas Secondary exists on the shared traditional territory of the Snaw'naw'as and Qualicum First Nations.

November has been a meaningful month at BSS, marked by important learning, reflection, and community connection. Together, we experienced a powerful Remembrance Day Ceremony led by our students. Our choir and concert band offered two emotional and beautifully performed pieces that set a thoughtful tone for the morning. We were honoured to welcome **Corporal Burrows**, who shared his story and spoke about the realities of service. His words reminded us that behind every uniform is a person — someone who has given their time, strength, and, in many cases, their life in service to others. Our ceremony also acknowledged **Indigenous Veterans Day on November 8th**, recognizing the contributions and sacrifices of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis veterans whose service has too often gone unacknowledged.

November 24th was our **MATA Professional Development Day**. These non-instructional days are valuable resource days for our staff to engage in their own learning to help better support students in their learning. Some of the topics from the day were: Indigenous story and Math concepts; Introduction to Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) Systems and Incorporating Them in the Classroom; and Design for Every Learner: Universal Design Learning Choice Boards with Artificial Intelligence.

This week, **learning updates** are being sent home (Friday). These updates offer a snapshot of your child's progress so far this term and support ongoing conversations about learning. **Diploma Verification Reports** are also going home with students in Grades 10–12. These documents outline where each student is on their graduation pathway and help ensure that course selections and planning are aligned with their goals.

Each month, we highlight a piece of our **Code of Conduct** to continue strengthening our shared expectations and sense of belonging. This month's focus was on respecting self. In Homeroom, we encouraged students to organize lockers and binders in an effort to demonstrate executive functioning skills. Brain science tells us that the prefrontal cortex is the last part of the brain to develop during the teenage years, making executive functioning difficult for our students. Repetition and reminders are ways we can all help our students stay organized for their learning and in the end, respect themselves in their learning journey.

BSS hosted our largest **Grade 8 Try a Trade Day** to date, on November 25th. All Grade 8 students participated in an engaging and interactive career-exploration experience. Local industry partners and post-secondary institutions generously shared their skills and expertise, giving students hands-on opportunities to explore a wide range of trades and career pathways. Every year, our Grade 8s tell us this is one of their favourite experiences, and this year was no exception. A huge thank you to our community partners and to everyone who helped make the day a success—especially **Mr. Muirhead** for his leadership and coordination.





As we approach winter conditions, we want to share a friendly reminder that schools will remain OPEN unless significant damage to a school site or similar circumstances makes it impossible to operate safely (e.g., with no heat, roads unsafe to travel). In the unlikely event that there is a school closure, the School District will do its best to communicate this information as early as possible.
