Superintendent, Dr. Peter Jory: <u>Budget season:</u> Thanked everyone for attending the Budget Meeting held on April 18th, 2023, No new gov't money, battling high inflation, gov't did announce funding for food to help with the food crisis, gov't is covering the cost of unionized negotiated wage increases, we're hoping for more grant money to be announced but nothing yet. All that said, we are going to be ok, our service levels should be kept the same.

Strategic Planning and Indigenous Education meetings/planning has been fantastic, SD is working with our Indigenous community to include First People's Learning into our schools, and we are working with a graphic designer.

<u>June 6th</u> - Presenting the outcomes from the Strategic planning sessions via a town hall/zoom format and this will be recorded and posted.

Bussing:

- 1. "We have to get off paper", currently all routes and pick up locations/details are basically on a piece of paper. This is not efficient or practical, and leads to mistakes being made. We want to revamp our system, modernize, make it more efficient, and get away from paper applications and move to an online application program. Paper applications primarily come in at once and make processing hard.
- 2. Routing software for buses needs to happen.

This software will help solve the challenges that have been found when a morning bus gets canceled. Cancellations don't just affect the one route. Ie: Canceling a bus in the morning also impacts kids' bussing needs in the afternoon b/c that bus doesn't just transport the same kids in the afternoon as it did in the morning.

Busing software will: help track buses, increase efficiency, and will increase rider safety. The SD will have real time information about who is on each bus and this improves child safety.

3. Annual Application Fees will begin in September 2023.

Currently we have approximately 1400 riders who exceed the walk limits within their school catchment area. These families are offered a free bus pass.

We currently have approximately 400 courtesy riders, families who choose to pay \$125/year fee to be able to have their child use our busing transportation services.

We know that on paper our buses are at capacity, yet we see approximately 20% of seats available on all of our buses on a regular basis. We hope that by implementing an annual application fee of \$25 families who actually need or want to use the bus system will apply, potentially increasing the

courtesy rider spots by approximately 20%.

They are still working out the details on how/if they can offer a cap on the number of application fees a family has to pay. Perhaps, you pay for the first 2 children's applications and that's it, your other applications are free. This is still in the works.

Huge bus driver hiring push is going on. Currently training some EA's who have shown interest to be back up bus drivers.

Dr. Jory does not like or want to ever have to charge families for anything, but his team believes that this application fee will potentially increase rider usage.

Provincial average for courtesy riders is \$200-300 per year per child, with Kelowna pushing for \$400.

VAPING ISSUES:

- Scott from Island Health has presented information on vaping for parents and youth and shared that the addiction level to vaping is huge. A vile of vape "juice" has 3x the nicotine as a regular pack of cigarettes does. Our youth are getting addicted and addicted fast.
- We are aware that we need to have a series of steps in place to help detour our youth from vaping. They are trying to create a clear plan where they share info with parents, they'll work with our youth to educate, and will have consequences.
- Asking for DPAC to support their efforts to reach out to our youth about vaping and other poor choices that we know are happening at the high school level.
- Bathrooms seem to be a favorite place for kids to vape.
- 2nd hand vape smoke is also quite concerning for non vaping kids using the bathrooms.
 (Kids with Asthma and home & visiting athletes for example) Karri asked that: even though we know vaping is not allowed, can we create a safe place for kids to use that is absolutely vape free.
- We know we need to start with education and bringing in guests who our youth can connect with to learn about the damages from vaping.

 - Agrees that vaping is a huge problem, there's so much out there and it is so easy to get, and

supports the SD trying to set up an anti-vaping campaign. This is not a Parksville/Qualicum issue, from his work at the provincial level, he knows this is a problem for all districts within our province.

• Budget process is a struggle and he appreciates all of the work that our SD is putting into balancing it. That said, since the late 1990's our Provincial Education budget has dropped by approximately HALF of what is used to be funded. Back in 2000, our Provincial gov't committed 4% of our GDP into education, and now it's supported at 2.2%. When the gov't says this is the most money ever put into education - that maybe true because of inflation, but when you compare to the GDP, they are only funding about half what they used to. That shortfall is what creates parents/pacs having to work hard to fill the gaps. Back in the 2000's pacs did not have to fundraise the way they do now, they were not asked to buy playgrounds etc. PLEASE WRITE/TALK to our local MLA and MP and make sure they know we want education properly funded, and ideally restored to the 4% of our GDP.

Important to see school represented at the School Board meetings, especially the special ones like the budget meeting. The SD needs to know what is important to families and kids and showing up is important, it's good to be represented. It has been announced that the SD anticipates approximately 30 FTE students less for the 2023/2024 year which translates to approximately 1 teacher and 2 EA's. That said, the 30 spaces is district wide so it will not necessarily equate to those staffing reductions. Associate Superintendent Gillian Wilson has previously shared that our SD already employs more EA's than we are bound to have to cover the needs of our learners. There won't necessarily be layoff, but quite possibly due to their collective agreement, they may see some changes to hours/shift.
