#### **USER GUIDE FOR FINANCIAL ALLOCATIONS**

Amount Provided: The BC Ministry of Education has placed a cap of \$600 per student, on the amount which DL schools may provide to support learners, with some exceptions, defined on the Ministry Policy web site. For 2014-15, CEAP will use \$50 of the per-student amount to compensate for services and resources provided free-of-charge, and provide the following amounts to students, according to our guidelines:

Enrolled before Sept 30<sup>th</sup>: \$550 per student Enrolled before February 10<sup>th</sup>: \$225 Enrolled before May 1<sup>st</sup>: \$175

# All purchases made with the fund allocation require teacher pre-approval.

All purchased made with your funds must be preapproved by the student's CEAP teacher, in-line with the student's current student learning plan (SLP), and entered onto the Financial Allocations Worksheet. After your initial SLP meeting with the teacher, the Worksheet can be adjusted throughout the school year. Approval for expenditures can be obtained via meetings, phone calls or emails with/to the teacher.

In the event that a purchase is made that is not identified in the SLP:

- 1. The fund will be frozen and no further payments will be made.
- 2. You will be issued an invoice for the unauthorized purchase.

#### **Release of Financial Assistance Funding**

Release of Financial Assistance Funding is dependent on having a signed SLP, the student being considered "Active" in his/her program and the financial information entered in a student's SLP. Additionally, these conditions apply:

Use of approved service providers
Return of evaluation forms, if required
Full-time Secondary Students: will be eligible for \$65
per active course, up to a maximum of 8 courses in the school year.

#### Internet Service

Up to \$300 per family may be provided for home Internet connection costs, in addition to the financial allocations provided above. The amount provided will be determined by CEAP, based on the amount of

Internet required per program and "in good standing" status of the student. Reimbursement requires the presentation to our office of an Internet monthly service invoice, prior to May 15th.

## Purchases that may be considered with prior approval include:

- Printed materials including books, workbooks, etc.
- Fine Arts lesson (i.e. dance, music, drama etc.)
- Musical instrument rental fees
- PE Activities (i.e. martial arts, swim lessons, gym fees, etc.)
- Specific computer software limits apply
- Annual memberships (i.e. Science World, Vancouver Aquarium, etc.) should be purchases at the start of the school year. CEAP will cover cost of one adult chaperone for K-9 students.
- Consumable curriculum supplies including calculators, headphones, and digital storage devices paper, pens, pencils, erasers, printer ink cartridges, etc., using charge card, \$50 maximum per year
- Graphing calculators for grades 11 and 12 math and physics students only

#### Purchases or Services not covered by CEAP:

- Any purchase not pre-approved by the student's CEAP teacher
- Equipment, with capital value, including computers, printers, sports equipment, telescopes, cameras, etc.
- Furniture
- Personal clothing items including uniforms, swimwear, backpacks, gym shoes, etc.
- Insurance
- Travel expenses, including gas, bus tickets, ferry fees, accommodations charges, etc.
- Restaurant or food purchases
- Items of a religious nature

#### Submission of invoices

It is usual for service providers to invoice CEAP directly, via email or postal mail; however, it is expected that any invoices or receipts received by parents will be conveyed to our office ASAP. Parents are to retain and submit all \$50 cash card receipts to CEAP.
