Principal's Report

1) Reporting

- Elementary portfolio reviews are being completed now, delayed because of snow.
- A new reflection document has been implemented for these reviews.
- Secondary students: TIDES teachers reporting on mid-point learning, KSS/BSS courses wrapping up this week, February 7th report cards available.

2) Looking ahead at next year

- February/March Mr. Bold speaks to CEAP grade 7's and gives paperwork on options for high school.
- Mr. Bold visits all elementary programs to advise what is offered at CEAP.

February 5th @ 5pm-Grade 7 parents and kids meet with Mr. Bold to discuss options with TIDES, DL, KSS/BSS and cross enrolling

February 11th @ 6:30pm-KSS grade 8 orientation

February 13th @ 6:30pm-BSS grade 8 orientation

In grades 10-12 there will continue to be flexibility. Adaptations can be made with regards to volume of Moodle work, format, content and timing. For example, doing 75% of a course does not mean a student's mark automatically loses 25%.

3) ADST curriculum

-Grade 8 Try-a-Trade has been held. Grade 8's were able to try various different trades such as metal work, carpentry, and roofing. Good feedback.

-There is a "Skills Exploration" course for grades 10 & 11 that is 1/3 electrical, 1/3 plumbing, and 1/3 carpentry. Aimed at giving basic DIY knowledge.

-Elementary students are working on design building for upcoming District Skills Day which will be held at Ballenas on Friday, February 7th.

Old Business

-CEAP Elementary Christmas shop earned \$161.50. Donation recipient is being voted on by intermediate students this week. Primary students voted for VI Compassion Dogs.

-Facebook page to stay, Rebecca has become admin.

-CEAP kitchen has had an Island Health visit. Suggested a thermometer for fridge, hand washing protocol signage, instructions for making food-safe surface sanitizer & larger scale dishwashing(if needed). As long as we are only handling food for CEAP-only events, Island Health is not involved. Any other restrictions/rules are School District imposed.
