Errington Families,

For the 2025-2026 school year, we will again be bulk purchasing our school supplies. We will be charging supply fee of \$50 for all students in grades K-7, with a maximum charge of \$100/family with multiple children attending EES. Families with Kindergarten students coming in the fall will be contacted separately closer to September with some more detailed instructions on how to pay this fee.

With the cost of living rising, the quotes we are receiving for our individual school supply lists are over \$80 per student. In order to help families, and support students with their learning, we are preparing to purchase the supplies for all our students to keep these costs down.

Our hope is that this will streamline things for families as they get ready to go back to school in the fall. Bulk ordering will also ensure teachers will have the supplies they truly need in their classes, as what one teacher needs for supplies, another may not require. Additionally, bulk ordering will provide consistency for the students as everyone in a class will have the same supplies. It is important that the students have quality supplies, and with the school's access to various vendors, we are able to provide this for our families in a cost-effective way.

We will open up School Cash Online for payment after July 3rd, with a due date of November 30th. If you are new to Errington, or are not able to access School Cash Online, then you can pay at the front office with cash or cheque. Families can pay the fee when they are able, either in full or in installments as it works for you.

If you feel this will be out of your reach, please contact the front office.

School Bus Registration for the 2025/26 School Year

School Bus Registration for the 2025/26 school year is now open! Go to the Qualicum School District Transportation <u>website</u> to access the online application form. Get your application in **before the end of this school year** for the best opportunity to secure a spot for you child and to **avoid extra fees**.

Bussing Fee Summary Table

*Parents and caregivers who believe these fees will cause financial hardship in their household are encouraged to speak to their school principal about fee relief. Options may include partial or even full fee waivers, depending on need, which will then be communicated by the principal to the Transportation Department.

REGISTRATION PROCESSING TIMELINES

April - June 30 only Eligible bus pass applications will be processed, on a first come/first served basis.

- If a bus reaches capacity, an <u>Eligible Rider wait lis</u>t will be created. You will be notified if you are put on a wait list.
- Courtesy rider applications received during this time will not be processed until after July 1.
- Exact bus route information will be distributed to families before the first day of school through My Ride K-12 website and App.

July 1- onwards Courtesy, as well as late Eligible bus pass applications will be processed on a first come/first served basis as space is available on the bus route(s) requested.

- Courtesy riders that are offered a space on the bus will be notified and asked to pay the necessary fees. When payment is received the application will be finalized. If payment is not made within 5 business days of being offered the space, the application will be redated and put back into the queue.
- If a bus reaches capacity, a wait list will be created. You will be notified if you are put on a wait list.
- Exact bus route information will be distributed to families before the first day of school through My Ride K-12 website and App.

Applications received after Sept 1 will be considered on a wait list and only accepted on a first come first served basis as space on busses allow.

Browse the Explore tab and borrow a book. Your book will open so you can start reading right away and it's available for 3 weeks.



B.C. Training and Education Savings Program Grant Flyer For students in Kindergarten through Grade 3

ATTENTION Parents and Guardians: Don't let your child miss out on a \$1,200 grant!

The B.C. Training and Education Savings Grant (BCTESG) is available to eligible children for a three-year window only. It can be used for their future post-secondary education and training.



Is my child eligible?

- Parent or guardian, plus the child are B.C. residents and have Social Insurance Numbers (SINs)
- The child is between their 6th birthday and the day before they turn 9

Make a plan today!

Step 1: Contact or visit your financial institution and ask if they offer the grant (most will).

Step 2: All you need is:

- Proof of residency: e.g. BC driver's licence, BC Identification Card, BC Services Card, or recent B.C. utilities bill
- Your Social Insurance Number (SIN)
- Your child's Social Insurance Number (SIN)*
 - *Apply for a SIN: https://www.canada.ca/en/employment-social-development/services/sin/apply.html

Step 3: During your appointment with your financial institution:

- Open a Registered Education Savings Plan (RESP) for your child (skip if already done)
- Complete application for the BCTESG. No need to add any of your own money!
