#### Welcome to Kindergarten!

We have our Welcome to Kindergarten afternoon on Wednesday June  $4^{th}$ , 2025 from 3:15 pm to 4:00 pm.

This is a great opportunity for our incoming Kindergarten students to meet with Kindergrten teachers, look around the school and for families to find out about the transition to Kindergarten.

#### **Families on the Move?**



Please let the school office know if your family will be moving next year. We are beginning to plan for next year, and it is helpful if we are aware of any students who will not be attending EES in September.

#### <u> Last Day - Thursday, June 26th - Early Dismissal</u>



As you likely know, the last school day is on Thursday, June 26<sup>th</sup>. Dismissal is 3 hours earlier than usual (**10:56am**). If your child will not be attending on the last day(s) of school, please be sure to contact your child's teacher and arrange for collection of year-end items (school

supplies, special projects, shoes and other personal belongings, learning update, etc.)



#### Grade 6:

Consent packages for Grade 6 students were sent home from the school in the fall. Public health nurses will be returning to offer Grade 6 immunizations in school-based clinics with the consent of a parent/guardian/representative on **Monday May 26<sup>th</sup>**, **2025**.

<u>Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine</u> is recommended in Grade 6 as part of the B.C. immunization schedule to prevent 6 types of cancer (cervical, oropharyngeal, anal, vaginal, vulvar, and penile cancers). The B.C. immunization schedule for Grade 6 students is 2 doses, 6 months apart.

#### **Kindergarten:**

Island Health is committed to making immunizations more accessible to children. Immunizations will be provided at the school for Kindergarten on **May 26th, 2025**.

Students in kindergarten will only be offered immunizations at school-based clinics with the consent of a parent/guardian.

Recently, a letter was sent home through the school for kindergarten students who are eligible for immunizations.

If your child brought home a letter and you have not already done so, complete the online provincial digital consent tool by May 20th, 2025.

If you do not have access to a computer or smart phone, please contact your local public health unit at the phone number below.

#### School Bus Registration for the 2025/26 School Year

School Bus Registration for the 2025/26 school year is now open! Go to the Qualicum School District Transportation <u>website</u> to access the online application form. Get your application in **before the end of this school year** for the best opportunity to secure a spot for you child and to **avoid extra fees**.

<sup>\*</sup>Parents and caregivers who believe these fees will cause financial hardship in their household are encouraged to speak to their school principal about fee relief. Options may include partial or even full fee waivers, depending on need, which will then be communicated by the principal to the Transportation Department.

#### **REGISTRATION PROCESSING TIMELINES**

**April - June 30** only Eligible bus pass applications will be processed, on a first come/first served basis.

- o If a bus reaches capacity, an <u>Eligible Rider wait list</u> will be created. You will be notified if you are put on a wait list.
- Courtesy rider applications received during this time will not be processed until after July 1.
- Exact bus route information will be distributed to families before the first day of school through My Ride K-12 website and App.

**July 1- onwards** Courtesy, as well as late Eligible bus pass applications will be processed on a first come/first served basis as space is available on the bus route(s) requested.

- o Courtesy riders that are offered a space on the bus will be notified and asked to pay the necessary fees. When payment is received the application will be finalized. If payment is not made within 5 business days of being offered the space, the application will be redated and put back into the queue.
- o If a bus reaches capacity, a wait list will be created. You will be notified if you are put on a wait list.
- Exact bus route information will be distributed to families before the first day of school through My Ride K-12 website and App.

Applications received after Sept 1 will be considered on a wait list and only accepted on a first come first served basis as space on busses allow.

# EES Gr.6/7 Students Recent Visits with Berwick Parksville Retirement Community

**Berwick Parksville** is thankful for a Government of Canada grant called New Horizons for Seniors Program 2024.2025.

Part of the grant is being used for a new project called Green Thumb Gardeners and it is an intergenerational project with split grades 6/7 from Errington Elementary School participating. Jeannine Krefting, Active Living Manager said, "We are thrilled to support the development of meaningful intergenerational connections between this inspiring group of students and our residents, as they collaborate on this valuable and enjoyable project."

Leading the project is Berwick Parksville Horticulturist Kelsey, who said "I love watching the joy and excitement of others learning what I love most, gardening; and passing it down for generations to come". In anticipation of the students' first visit, Kelsey and Jeannine took some residents to Seedy Saturday, where herbs, vegetable and flower seeds were picked, with knowledge and advice from Kelsey.

Three dates were set for the students to come to Berwick Parksville's studio and work alongside residents, actually going through the growing process from start to finish.

The first visit was on February 21<sup>st</sup>, when 19 students, 2 teachers and residents, under the direction of Kelsey, put soil into the cell trays and planted two seeds in each cell, a mixture of herbs, vegetables and flowers.

The next visit was 4<sup>th</sup> April, when 4" pots were painted. "The opportunity to get our students out into the community and connecting with others is a gift. Getting to participate in the Green Thumbs Project over a series of months fosters continued connection between residents and students. And, of course, plant growth and observation are part of our learning outcomes, but even more, is such an interest and useful skill for our students to learn about. We have so much gratitude for this special project!" -Rose Benoit, Teacher

"I'm grateful to do the Green Thumbs project because I like working with people in the community and seeing the plants grow with them." - Farrah, Grade 7


The last visit was 9<sup>th</sup> May, just before Mother's Day when the growing plants were transplanted into the pots and ready to take home as gifts.

# **B.C. Training and Education Savings Program Grant Flyer**For students in Kindergarten through Grade 3

## ATTENTION Parents and Guardians: Don't let your child miss out on a \$1,200 grant!

The B.C. Training and Education Savings Grant (BCTESG) is available to eligible children for a three-year window only. It can be used for their future post-secondary education and training.



#### Is my child eligible?

- Parent or guardian, plus the child are B.C. residents and have Social Insurance Numbers (SINs)
- ☐ The child is between their 6th birthday and the day before they turn 9

#### Make a plan today!

Step 1: Contact or visit your financial institution and ask if they offer the grant (most will).

Step 2: All you need is:

- □ Proof of residency: e.g. BC driver's licence, BC Identification Card, BC Services Card, or recent B.C. utilities bill
- ☐ Your Social Insurance Number (SIN)
- ☐ Your child's Social Insurance Number (SIN)\*
  - \*Apply for a SIN: https://www.canada.ca/en/employment-social-development/services/sin/apply.html

Step 3: During your appointment with your financial institution:

- Open a Registered Education Savings Plan (RESP) for your child (skip if already done)
- ☐ Complete application for the BCTESG. No need to add any of your own money!
