
School Photo Day


Please make sure your child's teacher is aware of your child's after school schedule. We need to know if your child is getting picked up (and by who) or taking the bus.

Fall Marimba Classes at the Errington Hall September 19 to November 28, 2024

For 10 weeks this fall, Thursdays will be Marimba Day at the Errington Hall. We're offering an after school program for kids ages 8 to 12. The classes start at 3:30 and end at 4:30.

Registration is capped at eight. Please note these are not drop in sessions as the learning is cumulative and the songs build on what was learned previously.

A grant allows us to offer the programs for a registration fee of only \$80 for the ten weeks. Classes begin on Thursday, September 19 and end on Thursday, November 28. There is no class on October 31.

The instructor is Ted Wright, co-founder of the marimba band Marimba Muzuva. Ted is an experienced teacher and very knowledgeable about marimba music and its traditions. He gives this description of his classes:

"Rhythm and music are an inherent part of human nature. In this class we'll use Zimbabwean marimbas to help each of us discover and nourish this part of ourselves. We will explore some Zimbabwean songs and different aspects of Zimbabwean culture. This is an opportunity to experience music and its many uplifting, joyous, and healing qualities, no matter your age or previous experience."
