


goal of \$500! We sincerely thank all families for their generous support of this meaningful cause.

Public Meetings of the Board of Education

Regular Public Meetings of the Board of Education of the Qualicum School District are held on the fourth Tuesday of each month during the school year, beginning in August.

Two exceptions are the December Board Meeting; which will be held on Tuesday, December 9th, and the March Board Meeting, which will be held on Tuesday, March 10th. There is no meeting held in July.

These meetings are business meetings of the Board which are held in public. The meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. and will be held virtually via Microsoft Teams until further notice. These meeting are recorded and posted on YouTube, usually on the day following the meeting. (The YouTube link can be found on the main page of the district website).

Committee of the Whole Meetings (Education, Policy and Finance & Operations) are also held monthly (no meetings are held in December, March, July and August). Check the district calendar for dates and times (usually the third week of each month with the exceptions of December, March, July and August). These meetings will be held virtually via Microsoft Teams until further notice. If the Board determines that these meetings will be recorded, the recordings will be posted on YouTube, usually within a day or two following the meeting via the YT link on the district website).



Drop-off and Pick-up

Please note that school begins at 8:30am. If you are dropping off your child prior to 8:30am, please use the Lower Parking Lot. If you are dropping off after 8:30am, you may pull up to the front of the school. Students who arrive after 8:35am must report to the office before going to their classroom.

Please make sure your child's teacher is aware of their after school schedule. We need to know if your child is getting picked up (and by who) or if they are taking the bus.
