

Playing Field

You will have noticed that our playing field has been fenced off. This is because the operations staff in the district has begun necessary upgrades to the irrigation system. Over the summer, a new pump house was built and two cisterns are being connected for future field irrigation.

In the next week or two, the majority of the fencing will be removed, and students will be able to play on the middle portion of the field through the fall and winter months.

Fencing will remain around the perimeter of the field while the main irrigation channels are installed. In the late spring, our field will be completely shut down for final irrigation hook ups, and then new seeding and sod. By next school year, we should have a healthy new field.
