MESSAGE FROM THE ADMINISTRATORS

So far it has been a busy January at Errington Elementary. We continue to encourage students to come to school in appropriate clothing for the weather and to make sure that there is a spare set of clothing in your son/daughters back pack. This will avoid any phone calls home to bring a change of clothes.

We often receive a number of phone calls for messages throughout the day that involve a change of plans after school. We prefer that these arrangements are made before school. If you need to phone to get a message to your child, please call in the morning, before lunch, if possible. This will allow us to ensure that each child receives their message before the end of the school day. We cannot guarantee that messages we receive at the end of the day will be given to your child, although every effort is made to give them this message. If a child will be going on a different bus to go to a friend's house, this needs to be planned ahead of time and a note needs to be brought to school stating what the plan is. Thank you for your understanding in these matter.

AFTER SCHOOL ARRANGEMENTS

Please make all after school arrangements before school starts. The office has had an influx of calls and it is very difficult to get these messages to students at times. Thank you in advance for supporting us with this issue.

VISITORS TO EES

Guests and community partners to EES include such people as retired individuals, parents, student teachers, work experience students, district personnel as well as members of our college/universities. For each visit, please follow this routine: 1. Check in at the office – sign the sign-in sheet and be sure to include all information (this is helpful in the event of such emergencies as earthquakes and fires or for important phone messages). 2. Ask Mrs. Martini or Ms. Webb for a visitor tag which will identify you as someone who belongs in our school. 3. When your visit is complete, please return your tag, and sign out on the sign-in sheet (again, during emergencies this is very helpful). Thank you for your support in making your visit safe and successful.

REMINDER TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS

For safety purposes, we need to know where every child is during the school day, therefore please make sure you sign out your child at the school office when leaving the school before the end of the day. Also, the school office must be advised by the parent/guardian if your child is not attending school. VALENTINE'S DAY GRAMS

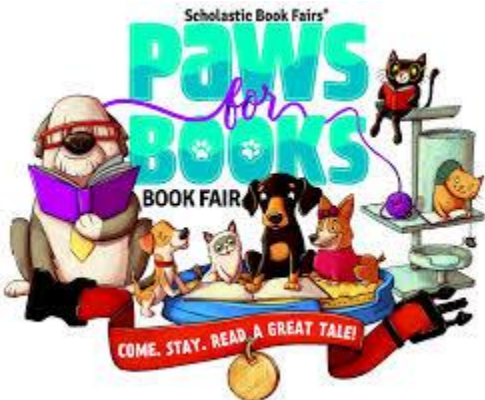

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Qualifying Age:

To qualify for school enrollment in September 2018, a child must become five years of age on or before December 31, 2018.

CROSS BOUNDARY INFORMATION

Cross Boundary Process:

Parents wishing to enroll their Kindergarten child at an out-of catchment school within the district are to **make their request upon registration** and complete an "Application for Cross-boundary Enrollment for Following School Year" Form. All "Application for Cross-boundary Enrollment for Following School Year" forms must be submitted during the months of February and March (first Monday in February to last Friday in March – prior to Spring Break). **Early applications will not be accepted.**

PROGRAMS OF CHOICE

School District 69 (Qualicum) is proud to offer a range of Programs of Choice that provide unique and innovative learning opportunities for our diverse student population.

Programs of Choice are staffed consistent with the district's overarching methodology and philosophy regarding financial prudence. For these reasons, Programs of Choice classrooms are often (like regular classrooms) organized into combined grade configurations. All program options either align with or support the B.C. curriculum and help provide a pathway towards Grade 12 graduation.

The Board of Education is committed to Programs of Choice placement sustainability to the best extent possible, but must balance this commitment with emergent building capacity pressures, and the importance of students being able to attend their neighbourhood school. All Programs of Choice are reviewed annually as part of the budget process. Programs of Choice typically generate much interest and are continued each year, however they can be subject to cancellation due to enrollment and budgetary considerations. 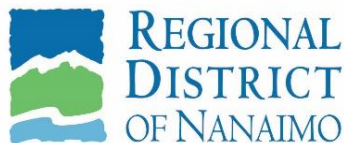
French Immersion:
