Principal's Message

We value parents being involved in their child's education at Errington Elementary and welcome volunteers in our building. There is a strong link between the success of a child in school and the level of parental involvement. Parents of children at Errington Elementary School are involved in their child's education in many ways, ranging from reading with their children at home, to participation in the parent's advisory council (PAC). The level of involvement varies, but each form of involvement carries both **rights** and **responsibilities**. To make each visit a successful one, we have included some reminders and guidelines to follow.

Volunteering

- Parents have a **right** to volunteer their time and expertise to the school.
- Parents have a **responsibility** to respect the decision of the teacher if the teacher feels their presence will be distracting to the learning environment.
- Parents have a responsibility to provide a criminal record check, which is required by School District policy.
- It is the **responsibility** of the volunteer to check in at the office.

A Volunteer's Code of Ethics

- Respect the confidentiality of the teacher and the children.
- Practice tolerance and understanding towards the children and teachers with whom you come into contact.
- Be sensitive to the teaching role and understand that there are a variety of teaching approaches and styles.
- Strive for acceptance of all the children.
- Be dependable. If you must be late or absent, please call the school and try to arrange for an acceptable substitute.

Parent Teacher Conferences

EES teachers will be meeting with parents later in October. Teachers will be available to meet during the evening of Thursday, October 25th between 4:00pm and 6:00pm. Teachers have also made themselves available for other times during this week. We will be using the "Parent Conferences" online program again this year to book your appointment. Directions on how to use this



booking system are listed below. If you are not able to schedule an appointment during one of the times listed, please contact your child's teacher directly to arrange an alternate time. The online booking system should be available by **Thursday**, **October 11th**. Please note that October 18th is a "Conferencing Adjustment Day", where students do not attend. Conferences will not be scheduled on this day.

Communicating student learning is an essential part of education. Here is an article outlining questions to ask at your parent-teacher conference:

Parent-teacher conferences can help you learn more about your child's strengths and weaknesses. They can also give you a better idea about the year ahead. Here are 10 questions you might ask your child's teacher:

- 1. What will you cover in this grade or subject this year?
- 2. **What are your expectations** for homework? Has my child missed any of her assignments so far?
- 3. How are my child's work habits? Does she use time in class well?
- 4. **Does my child** read at the level you would expect for this grade?
- 5. Is my child able to do the math you expect for a student in this grade?
- 6. Is my child in different groups for different subjects?
- 7. Has my child missed any classes other than the ones I contacted the school about?
- 8. Does my child qualify for any special programs?
- 9. Does my child get along well with the other students?
- 10. What can I do at home to help my child be more successful?

School Appointments - Parent Instructions

- 1. Go to our school appointments web site: http://ees.parentconferences.net
- 2. Click to "**REGISTER**" (top box).
- 3. Complete all the required fields.
- 4. Click "REGISTER NOW".
- 5. Click "Add Student".
- 6. Complete the required fields.
- 7. Click "Insert".
- 8. Next to your child's name, click on the **blue calendar icon**. Click on the **blue calendar** beside your child's teacher name. When teacher is highlighted, click on **View Calendars**.
- 9. Click on **an appointment day and time** that you would like to book. Note your name is automatically put into the field at this time. Others who look on this calendar will not see your name, they will just see that the time slot is not available.
- 10. Click Book Appointment.

11. If you have more than one teacher:

Go back to Home.

Click Manage Students.

Add **New Student**.

Complete the fields as above and continue with the rest of the process to book your other appointment(s).

Reporting Student Absents

When reporting your child's absence, please call the office at 250-248-8446 (after hours you can leave a message on our answering service – just listen for the option to report a student absence in the directory). It is important to let the office know if your child will be late or not attending school for the day(s) so your child is accounted for. It only takes a minute. If your child is not at school or late you can expect to receive a call to your main number. Thank you in advance for reporting early!

Use of Technology

We value the use of technology as an integral part of teaching and learning. Our handheld devices have become part of our daily routines and give us access to a wide variety of tools, including photographing our students doing all sorts of activities at school. We have noticed that some photos of our students have appeared on social media – we understand that people taking and sharing photos during school sanctioned activities are doing so with good intentions. What people may not realize is that we have a number of students who have media



restrictions in place and parents have indicated they do not want their child's photo to appear publically. In order to respect the privacy of our students, we ask that you do **NOT** download, copy, or distribute any pictures or other personal information through social media that contain images of students and/or student work other than your child's.

Unsafe Litter

Although we have not had any recent reports of "unsafe litter" on our school property, we have been hearing reports of unsafe litter around public spaces in our community. We felt it would be a good time to teach/remind our children of what to do if they encounter unsafe litter. Please take some time to discuss items that are "safe" to pick-up and items that are "unsafe" to pick up. We know that children can be very helpful, but we don't want to put them at risk for picking up something that could be dangerous to themselves or others. Items such as broken glass, sharp metal, and needles need to be disposed of with care. Images of needles can be easily found online to show your child what they look like. If your child comes across a dangerous item, we advise them to report to an adult immediately. If something is found on school property, we are required to follow procedures for safe disposal. Sharp items should never be discarded straight into a garbage can. They should be in some kind of container so as not to poke through a plastic bag and injure an employee who is handling garbage bags. There are several "safe" containers available around the community to dispose used needles so as not to put the public at risk. We still encourage everyone to help keep our public spaces free of litter – we just ask that people use extreme caution if they encounter unsafe litter.

Influenza season is approaching! Oceanside Public Health is extending an invitation to families with eligible children to attend one of our family flu clinics throughout November and December. In addition, Oceanside Public Health will be hosting a public influenza drop-in clinic for all eligible individuals on Monday November $5^{th}/18$ from 10am-2pm at the Qualicum Beach Civic Centre. No appointment necessary.
