## Principal's Message

We value parents being involved in their child's education at Errington Elementary and welcome volunteers in our building. There is a strong link between the success of a child in school and the level of parental involvement. Parents of children at Errington Elementary School are involved in their child's education in many ways, ranging from reading with their children at home, to participation in the parent's advisory council (PAC). The level of involvement varies, but each form of involvement carries both **rights** and **responsibilities**. To make each visit a successful one, we have included some reminders and guidelines to follow.

#### Volunteering

- Parents have a **right** to volunteer their time and expertise to the school.
- Parents have a **responsibility** to respect the decision of the teacher if the teacher feels their presence will be distracting to the learning environment.
- Parents have a **responsibility** to provide a criminal record check, which is required by School District policy.
- It is the **responsibility** of the volunteer to check in at the office.

#### A Volunteer's Code of Ethics

- Respect the confidentiality of the teacher and the children.
- Practice tolerance and understanding towards the children and teachers with whom you come into contact.
- Be sensitive to the teaching role and understand that there are a variety of teaching approaches and styles.
- Strive for acceptance of all the children.
- Be dependable. If you must be late or absent, please call the school and try to arrange for an acceptable substitute.

## Parent Teacher Conferences

EES teachers will be meeting with parents later in October. Teachers will be available to meet during the evening of Wednesday, October 23<sup>rd</sup>. Teachers have also made themselves available for other times during this week. We will be using the "Parent Conferences" online program again this year to book your appointment. Directions on how to use this booking system are

listed below. If you are not able to schedule an appointment during one of the times listed, please contact your child's teacher directly to arrange an alternate time. The online booking system should be available by **Tuesday**, **October 15<sup>th</sup>**. Please note that <u>October 24<sup>th</sup></u> is a "Conferencing Adjustment Day", where students do not attend. Conferences will not be scheduled on this day.

Communicating student learning is an essential part of education. Here is an article outlining questions to ask at your parent-teacher conference:

Parent-teacher conferences can help you learn more about your child's strengths and weaknesses. They can also give you a better idea about the year ahead. Here are 10 questions you might ask your child's teacher:

- 1. What will you cover in this grade or subject this year?
- 2. What are your expectations for homework? Has my child missed any of her assignments so far?
- 3. How are my child's work habits? Does she use time in class well?
- 4. Does my child read at the level you would expect for this grade?
- 5. Is my child able to do the math you expect for a student in this grade?
- 6. Is my child in different groups for different subjects?
- 7. Has my child missed any classes other than the ones I contacted the school about?
- 8. Does my child qualify for any special programs?
- 9. Does my child get along well with the other students?
- 10. What can I do at home to help my child be more successful?

#### School Appointments - Parent Instructions

- 1. Go to our school appointments web site: http://ees.parentconferences.net
- 2. Click to "REGISTER" (top box).
- 3. Complete all the required fields.
- 4. Click "REGISTER NOW".
- 5. Click "Add Student".
- 6. Complete the required fields.
- 7. Click "Insert".
- 8. Next to your child's name, click on the **blue calendar icon.** Click on the **blue calendar** beside your child's teacher name. When teacher is highlighted, click on **View Calendars**.
- 9. Click on **an appointment day and time** that you would like to book. Note your name is automatically put into the field at this time. Others who look on this calendar will not see your name, they will just see that the time slot is not available.
- 10. Click Book Appointment.

#### 11. If you have more than one teacher:

Go back to Home.

#### Click Manage Students.

#### Add New Student.

Complete the fields as above and continue with the rest of the process to book your other appointment(s).

#### <u>Halloween</u>

As you know, Halloween is on Thursday, October 31<sup>st</sup>. We have decided to once again allow students to wear costumes if they wish! We do have some guidelines that must be followed to ensure everyone has a safe and fun day:



- Masks are NOT to be worn outside on the playground or in the hallways and washrooms.
  Teachers will give direction on the expectations in classrooms.
- No heavy make-up.
- Leave all costume "weapons" at home (swords, knives, guns, etc.).
- Bring a change of clothes (some students have PE class and may be asked to change if the costume interferes with mobility).
- Due to concerns about "Creepy Clowning", we ask that students avoid costumes of this nature.

#### **Inclement Weather and Clothing**

The fall weather is upon us! It is extremely important for students to have appropriate clothing and footwear for outdoor use, along with a pair of inside shoes to change into when inside the building. These shoes are also used for gym use. We expect students to wear warm coats



(hoods are a good idea) and we recommend boots, hats, gloves, and umbrellas. In general, students go outside to play during recess and lunch breaks, even if it is raining or snowing. Each day, we assess the combination of weather, wind, and temperature to determine whether or not it is suitable for the students to play outside. We recommend that students have a spare change of clothing kept at school in case of various emergencies. We have a very limited supply of clothing available.

#### **Reporting Student Absents**

When reporting your child's absence, please call the office at 250-248-8446 (after hours you can leave a message on our answering service – just listen for the option to report a student absence in the directory). It is important to let the office know if your child will be late or not attending school for the day(s) so your child is accounted for. It only takes a minute. If your child is not at school or late you can expect to receive a call to your main number. Thank you in advance for reporting early!



Our school buses will be arriving later than they have in the past. This means that school buses will be using the area in front of the school right up until 8:15am. Please be sure to use the lower parking lot for drop-off. If your child is arriving AFTER 8:15am, you may pull up to the front of the school and your child will need to check in at the office. Please DO NOT pull up in front of the school prior to 8:15am.

We have observed several parents with students cutting through the staff parking lot before and after school on their way to and from the lower parking lot. Please use the pathway provided. We have staff vehicles coming and going so we need to ensure that our students and families are safe.

Please also note that the lower parking lot is considered to be part of our school grounds. As per school district policy, we ask that you do not smoke or use vaping devices on school grounds – including the parking areas.

## Use of Technology

We value the use of technology as an integral part of teaching and learning. Our handheld devices have become part of our daily routines and give us access to a wide variety of tools, including photographing our students doing all sorts of activities at school. We have

noticed that some photos of our students have appeared on social media – we understand that people taking and sharing photos during school sanctioned activities are doing so with good intentions. What people may not realize is that we have a number of students who have media restrictions in place and parents have indicated they do not want their child's photo to appear publically. In order to respect the privacy of our students, we ask that you do NOT download, copy, or distribute any pictures or other personal information through social media that contain images of students and/or student work other than your child's.



# <u>Bike Safety</u>

It has been wonderful to see some students choosing to ride their bikes to and from school! Please remind your children that we expect bike helmets to be worn at all times while riding. We highly recommend sending your child with a lock for their bike while parked at EES during the school day. At the end of the school day, we ask that students wait to leave on their bikes until AFTER the buses have left the parking lot. We ask that bikers remember that when using crosswalks, please stop and look before walking out; dismount bicycle and check for traffic and walk across; DO NOT just ride up and ride across. Drivers need some notice.

# NEW WAY TO PAY

Our district has made it possible to pay for any school fees online. If your student's classroom teacher has requested to use agendas, a sheet with detailed instructions on how to sign up for School Cash Online has come home. If your student's teacher is not using agendas this year a detail sheet will come home shortly. On our Errington Website there is a direct link to <u>www.schoolcashonline.com</u>, it is quite easy to sign up. Once signed up you will receive email notifications if there is a fee associated with your student. You are still able to pay for any school fees with cash or cheque, but we are offering the option to pay <u>online</u>.
