# Principal's Message

It is hard to believe that we are at the half-way point of the school year! Routines are well established and work can become challenging as students move along the learning continuums and expectations are increased. On Wednesday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>, your child will receive a "Learning Update" (otherwise known as Report Cards). You will notice language that reflects your child's growth along learning continuums and will likely describe how much support your child requires for certain activities: direct support, guided support, or independence. The article below suggests some strategies to help your child become more independent, especially when they face increased challenges. Are you teaching your child how to be resilient? We have faced many challenges this year and by working through challenges, we become even more resilient.

All students face obstacles. Encouraging resilience helps kids overcome them. Resilient students deal with challenges in positive ways – at home and at school. Answer yes or no to the questions below to see if you are helping your child develop resilience:

- 1. **Do you give** your child opportunities to make decisions? It's a skill that improves with practice.
- 2. **Do you talk** to your child about how you find a solution when you are faced with a problem?
- 3. **Do you talk** to your child about her strengths? Children draw on their strengths when facing challenges.
- 4. **Do you remind** your child when she's struggling how she has handled tough situations in the past?
- 5. **Do you listen** to your child when she is trying to make a decision without solving the problem for her?

**How well are you doing?** Mostly yes answers mean you are helping your child become more resilient. For *no* answers, try those ideas from the quiz.

The Board of Education is committed to Programs of Choice placement sustainability to the best extent possible, but must balance this commitment with emergent building capacity pressures, and the importance of students being able to attend their neighbourhood school. All Programs of Choice are reviewed annually as part of the budget process. Programs of Choice typically generate much interest and are continued each year, however they can be subject to cancellation due to enrollment and budgetary considerations. The Primary Learning Community Program is a new primary program for children between the ages of 5 and 8 years old which explores learning for students and educators through play, inquiry and curiosity. The community will encourage collaborative conversation between educators, learners and families. Play is the foundational principle of the program as research has indicated child development and growth requires children to practice, imagine, and be curious so that they are able to build resiliency and take necessary risk to grow and learn. Our goal for the Primary Learning Community Program is to work and learn in multi-age learning spaces.

#### CEAP Program

The Collaborative Education Alternative Program provides a blended-learning kindergarten program that consists of home-schooling in addition to being supported by scheduled student activities at Qualicum Commons – CEAP classroom. Learning resources as well as support for parent(s) is provided by the program teacher.

# **Other Important Reminders**

- We are required to follow the BC Healthy Food and Beverage Guidelines when serving food in schools. If you are wanting to send treats to school to help celebrate a special occasion, please contact your child's teacher in advance to make arrangements. Food must be prepared and packaged in a Food Safe Certified facility.
- Please make sure your child has appropriate clothing and footwear for outdoor use, along with a pair of inside shoes and an extra change of clothes. We also recommend having a warm coat, hat, umbrella, and gloves. We have a good supply of clothing and hand-knit items on hand. Please let us know if your child is in need of any winter clothing.

- If you haven't paid your child's school fees, please contact the school office or classroom teacher.
- When reporting your child's absence, please call the office at 250-248-8446 (after hours you can leave a message on our answering service just listen for the option to report a student absence in the directory). It is important to let the office know if your child will be late or not attending school for the day(s) so your child is accounted for. It only takes a minute. If your child is not at school or late you can expect to receive a call to your main number. Thank you in advance for reporting early!
- Due to current guidelines, school buses are **not** to be used for any other purpose (ie. play dates). The Transportation Department have asked that parents **do not send notes** with their child requesting to ride another bus. Students are only permitted to ride the bus they are registered with. Please refer to the School District website for all school bus information.

#### **Learning Updates**



On Wednesday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>, your child will receive a "Learning Update" (otherwise known as Report Cards). As we have outlined in previous newsletters, we are well into a significant transformation in public education in BC – not only with the redesigned curriculum, but also in the ways we communicate student learning.

The Ministry of Education has provided school districts with the flexibility to determine how this communication of student learning will take place. Teachers in School District 69 are continuing to use a locally developed "Learning Update" that accompanies a portfolio.

Teachers take great pride in their work with their students and will continue to connect with you in a variety of ways throughout the year – through class newsletters, student planners and home folders, phone calls, emails, electronic portfolios, informal conversations, and the parent/teacher conference opportunities during the year.

If you haven't already, we encourage you to establish an ongoing mode of communication with your child's teacher so that you can understand where your child is at with various aspects of their learning, what challenges he/she is facing, and where to go next with learning.



# Snow

The current weather forecast shows snow in the near future! We wanted to send out a reminder about our expectations around sledding. If we have a significant amount of snow accumulate, we will allow students to slide down the hill to the field. We only allow this during recess and lunch breaks (not before or after school) and we only allow

students to slide down on a sliding device and they must be wearing snow clothes (waterproof pants and coat, boots, gloves, etc.)! Our expectation is that snow has to cover the ground completely (no grass showing) in order to slide. We will set up a coned area for the students to slide down and expect them to wait until previous sliders have exited the area before sliding. We ask students to walk back up the hill on either side of the coned off area.

We do allow students to bring items to slide on, but please note that they are not accepted on the school bus and they are not stored inside the school. Teachers will be asking students to leave their sliding devices on the walkway outside the classroom during instructional time. Please make sure your child's sled is labelled clearly with their name!
