### Principal's Message

As you are most likely making plans for the summer break from school, we encourage you to consider having your child do some volunteer work. There are many opportunities to volunteer or provide service to our community, even during a global pandemic. The article below suggests some ways that summer volunteer work can build character and leadership:

The world's problems can seem overwhelming. But kids can learn that every person can make a difference, and when people work together, the results are amazing! Summer volunteering is a great way to teach this lesson to your child – all while building his confidence, compassion and leadership skills. To get started, talk with your child about:

- Interests. What subjects interest him most? How do they relate to others' needs? If he loves animals, he could help an animal rescue group. If he's interested in business, he might help with a charity fundraiser. Your child's enthusiasm is a great motivator.
- **Skills.** Your child's strengths can be gifts to others. He might hold a bake sale or read to younger children. Sometimes it's fun to learn new skills, too, such as how to help with landscaping or home repairs.
- Needs. Perhaps your child has noticed a park that needs sprucing up. Or maybe a homeless shelter needs food. Go online with your child and search for upcoming community service events in your area. You could even ask your child's teacher if the school needs help over the summer.
- Schedules. Volunteering takes time, and families are busy! Set realistic goals that leave room for other priorities. Depending on your family's commitments, you and your child might volunteer just a few hours here and there or decide to take on one large, exciting project!

## Kindergarten Orientation



On June 16<sup>th</sup> we will be hosting a "Welcome to Kindergarten" orientation session for new Kindergarten students and their families. This outdoor, "walk-thru" event will give families a chance to see our school, meet some staff, and have some fun in a safe way while following the usual health protocols. Families have been contacted to arrange a staggered start time, in order to maintain physical distancing requirements. Parents will be parking in the lower parking lot and walking up to the area in front of the main entrance to begin their tour. Families will receive a bag of early learning resources on this afternoon! Information about this orientation session has been sent home to incoming Kindergarten families. ## Other Important Reminders

- We are required to follow the BC Healthy Food and Beverage Guidelines when serving food in schools. If you are wanting to send treats to school to help celebrate a special occasion, please contact your child's teacher in advance to make arrangements. Food must be prepared and packaged in a Food Safe Certified facility.
- Please make sure your child has appropriate clothing and footwear for outdoor use, along with a pair of inside shoes, an extra change of clothes, and a refillable water bottle. We also recommend having a warm coat, hat, and umbrella for wet days and sunscreen and a hat for warm days.
- When reporting your child's absence, please call the office at 250-248-8446 (after hours you can leave a message on our answering service just listen for the option to report a student absence in the directory). It is important to let the office know if your child will be late or not attending school for the day(s) so your child is accounted for. It only takes a minute. If your child is not at school or late you can expect to receive a call to your main number. Thank you in advance for reporting early!
- Due to current guidelines, school buses are **not** to be used for any other purpose (i.e. play dates). The Transportation Department have asked that parents **do not send notes** with their child requesting to ride another bus. Students are only permitted to ride the bus they are registered with. Please refer to the School District website for all school bus information.

# 2021-22 School Year Bus Pass Information and Procedure

As we get ready for the upcoming school year, it is important to note the changes being made to the Bus Pass Procedure.

#### ELECTRONIC BUS PASS SYSTEM

- Starting with the new school year, the district is implementing an electronic bus pass system, referred to as ZPass. This allows the district to track, in real time, which bus a student traveled on and when/where they got on/off. Students will be issued, after the application process is completed, a lanyard with a bus pass which is encoded with a tracking #; students will be required to scan the card when boarding and leaving the bus both morning and afternoon.
- This bus pass will stay with the child throughout their school years with SD#69(Qualicum). At the end of each school year, the passes will be deactivated (student keeps the pass). After the application process is completed for the following year, the pass will be reactivated. A child in kindergarten could have the same pass for 13 years! Replacement bus passes are \$15.00; family will be responsible for replacing the lanyard.
- Similar to what is currently being done, eligible rider bus passes will be processed first, with a cut off date, followed by courtesy riders and any eligible riders that missed the cut off, as space allows.
- If your child is continually not riding the bus, you will be notified and the bus pass will be deactivated.

#### **BUS PASS PROCEDURE**

- June 9 July 30, 2021 ELIGIBLE ONLY bus pass applications will be accepted & processed on a first come/first served basis.
  - If a bus reaches capacity, an Eligible Rider Wait List will be created. You will be notified if you are put on this list.
  - Distribution of bus passes see below for the process
  - <u>Courtesy rider applications will not be received at this time</u>, so please do not send them in!
- August 3, 2021 onwards Courtesy rider applications, as well as eligible that missed the above cut off date, will be received and processed on a first come/first served basis as space is available on the bus route(s) requested.
  - Courtesy riders that are offered a space on the bus will be notified and asked to make the payment. When payment is received, the bus pass will be issued (see below for distribution process).
  - If payment is not made within 1 week of being offered the space, the application will be re-dated and put at the bottom of the pile.
  - If a bus reaches capacity, a wait list will be created.

#### **COMPLETING THE BUS PASS APPLICATION FORM**

- Be sure to read the 2021-2022 School Bus Information sheet found below
- One form/child/address
- Parent/Guardian to complete sections 1,2,3 of the application form
- If unsure of the stop name, refer to the 'School Bus Schedule' below. Each school has a list of bus stops find the closest one to your address
- Fax or email the completed application form(s) to the number/email supplied on the form

#### **BUS PASS DISTRIBUTION**

• Bus passes will be processed by the Transportation Dept. and sent to the school available for pick up, at the school office, starting August 23, 2021

Due to the ongoing pandemic and initial rollout of COVID vaccine, public health has postponed some routine Grade 6 and 9 immunizations originally planned for January and February. This delay is temporary and follows the B.C. Centre for Disease Control (BCCDC) guidelines for the school age immunization program. Routine school immunizations will resume in the coming weeks and continue until the end of the school year, resulting in immunizations being offered to all Grade 6 and 9 students before the end of June.

Public Health offered the first round of Grade 6 vaccines in the Fall of 2020 and will be contacting families in late Spring to book appointments for the second dose. Grade 9 consent packages were sent home from school last week. Please complete these forms and return them to the school ASAP.
