Principal's Message

We are pleased to say that most of our families have signed up to receive the online newsletter and we are now producing less than 5 paper copies to those families who have indicated to us that they prefer to receive a paper copy. We publish a newsletter every two weeks, on a Friday. Families who have signed up to receive our online newsletter get a notification email with a link sent as soon as the newsletter is ready. Signing on to the online newsletter also means that your email address is on the list to get important updates in emergent situations. Families who have contacted the main office to sign-up for a paper copy receive their newsletter either on the Friday or the following Monday. We also post our newsletters to the EES website in the "Newsletter Archives" quick link. We have heard that some families are not receiving newsletters. We hope that if you are reading this, you can help spread the word to anyone who mentions that they are not receiving newsletters. School newsletters, classroom newsletters, and the EES website are all places to get important information about the things we have going on at school.

We have continued to promote the common language used in our Code of Conduct for social responsibility: We are SAFE, We are RESPECTFUL, and We are RESPONSIBLE. The article below suggests some habits at home which can help your child thrive in school and in life:

Every family – and every child – is different, but there are ways all families can set their children up for success. Studies show that kids are more likely to achieve in elementary school and beyond when their parents give them the tools to succeed. To help your child:

- **Assign chores.** Kids who have responsibilities around the house learn how to be responsible. Give your child a list of weekly tasks to complete. He may grumble, but don't give in.
- **Teach social skills.** Your child's success in life hinges on more than grades; it centers on his ability to get along with others. Model good behavior like cooperation and courtesy.
- **Set the bar high.** Expect your child to do well and he'll rise to the occasion. Don't demand perfect grades but do insist he work to the best of his ability. And praise him when he tries hard even if he falls short. When you show him you believe in him, he'll believe in himself.
- **Nurture your relationship.** You are your child's parent, not his friend. But you're also his ally. So, make time to have fun together! Share a hobby. Play catch in the yard. Never let your child forget you're on the same team.
- Take care of yourself. If you're always stressed, your child will be, too. Carve out time to relax, exercise, or curl up with a good book. A calm, peaceful home starts with you.

We are using the "Parent Conferences" online program again this year to book your appointment. Directions on how to use this booking system are listed below and will be open for



bookings on Monday evening (October 19th). If you are not able to schedule an appointment during one of the times listed, please contact your child's teacher directly to arrange an alternate time.

School Appointments - Parent Instructions

- 1. Go to our school appointments web site: http://ees.parentconferences.net
- 2. Click to "REGISTER" (top box).
- 3. Complete all the required fields.
- 4. Click "REGISTER NOW".
- 5. Click "Add Student".
- 6. Complete the required fields.
- 7. Click "Insert".
- 8. Next to your child's name, click on the **blue calendar icon**. Click on the **blue calendar** beside your child's teacher name. When teacher is highlighted, click on **View Calendars**.
- 9. Click on **an appointment day and time** that you would like to book. Note your name is automatically put into the field at this time. Others who look on this calendar will not see your name, they will just see that the time slot is not available.
- 10. Click Book Appointment.
- 11. If you have more than one teacher:

Go back to **Home**.

Click Manage Students.

Add New Student.

Complete the fields as above and continue with the rest of the process to book your other appointment(s).

Note: You can edit or delete names if you have made a mistake.

Communicating student learning is an essential part of education. Here is an article outlining questions to ask at your parent-teacher conference:

Parent-teacher conferences can help you learn more about your child's strengths and weaknesses. They can also give you a better idea about the year ahead. Here are 10 questions you might ask your child's teacher:

- 1. What will you cover in this grade or subject this year?
- 2. What are your expectations for homework? Has my child missed any of her assignments so far?
- 3. How are my child's work habits? Does she use time in class well?
- 4. Does my child read at the level you would expect for this grade?
- 5. Is my child able to do the math you expect for a student in this grade?
- 6. Is my child in different groups for different subjects?
- 7. Has my child missed any classes other than the ones I contacted the school about?
- 8. **Does my child qualify** for any special programs?
- 9. Does my child get along well with the other students?
- 10. What can I do at home to help my child be more successful?

at school on Thursday, October 29th. Thank you to our Grade 6/7 leadership club students for planning such a great day for our school community. We have decided to once again allow students to wear costumes if they wish! Students may wear a costume on Friday, October 30th. If your child does not want to wear a costume, we encourage students to wear black and/or orange. We do have some costume guidelines that must be followed to ensure everyone has a safe and fun day:

- Masks are NOT to be worn outside on the playground or in the hallways and washrooms. Teachers will give direction on the expectations in classrooms.
- No heavy make-up.
- Leave all costume "weapons" at home (swords, knives, guns, etc.).
- Bring a change of clothes (some students have PE class and may be asked to change if the costume interferes with mobility).
- Due to ongoing concerns about "Creepy Clowning", we ask that students avoid costumes of this nature.

Food and Treats

Please be reminded that we are required to follow the BC Healthy Food and Beverage Guidelines when serving food in schools. If you are wanting to send treats to school to help celebrate a special occasion, please contact your child's teacher in advance to make arrangements. Food must be prepared and packaged in a Food Safe Certified facility.

Reminders from the Office

If you haven't done so already, please complete the required forms sent out a few weeks ago:

- Student Verification Form (white sheet)
- Student Health and Emergency Information (green sheet)

These are annually updated and are required in order to keep our records current. If you haven't received the forms mentioned above, please contact your child's teacher or the office.

If you haven't done so already, please click the link below to fill out the required form to indicate that you agree to conduct a "Daily Health Check" prior to your child arriving at school each day. You don't need to fill out the form every day, but we do require to fill out the form once to indicate that you are checking for symptoms each day.

Please note that if you are reporting your child's absence from school and the absence is NOT health related, it is helpful to know this so we can avoid some of the necessary follow-up phone calls. You can simply state that the absence is NOT health related.

Reporting Student Absents

When reporting your child's absence, please call the office at 250-248-8446 (after hours you can leave a message on our answering service – just listen for the option to report a student absence in the directory). It is important to let the office know if your child will be late or not attending school for the day(s) so your child is accounted for. It only takes a minute. If your child is not at school or late you can expect to receive a call to your main number. Thank you in advance for reporting early!

Inclement Weather and Clothing

Although we have had sunny days, we know that soon the rainy weather will be upon us! It is extremely important for students to have appropriate clothing and footwear for outdoor use, along with a pair of inside shoes to change into when inside the building. These shoes are also



used for gym use. We expect students to wear warm coats (hoods are a good idea) and we recommend boots, hats, gloves, and umbrellas. In general, students go outside to play during recess and lunch breaks, even if it is raining or snowing. Each day, we assess the combination of weather, wind, and temperature to determine whether or not it is suitable for the students to play outside. We recommend that students have a spare change of clothing kept at school in case of various emergencies. We have a very limited supply of clothing available
