Principal's Message

As we begin March, our thoughts turn towards spring break. The time away from school will be a good chance to reflect, rest and recharge our bodies and minds, and prepare for the spring term.

We continue our focus on supporting students to develop social awareness. The article below provides some suggestions on how you can support your child at home:

When children have the ability to understand and empathize with others, they are able to form solid connections with classmates, teachers, and friends. Social awareness allows kids to feel compassion for others – even when their background, beliefs, and culture may be different.

It is important to for children to see all people as equal and to accept and recognize the strengths of people who are different from them. To guide your child:

- **Remember** that you teach by example. Do you use slurs? Have you formed opinions about people based on their colour, religion, or culture? If so, your child may too.
- **Talk about** your family background. Unless you are an [Indigenous Person], someone in your family came here from another country. Remind your child that at some point, everyone has struggled to find their place.
- Let your child know it's never OK to judge, insult or treat someone badly because of their appearance or background.
- **Talk about** prejudice and stereotypes. Remind your child that background does not show how smart a person is, how good they will be at sports, or even what kind of food they like.
- **Explain** that rules and laws have not always treated everyone fairly, and that we are trying to change that.
- Welcome people of many backgrounds into your family's life. Encourage your child to do the same.

All "Applications for Cross-boundary Enrollment for Following School Year' forms must be submitted by Wednesday, March 15th, 2023.



Grounds Update

We are very pleased to report some upcoming improvements to our school grounds!

You may notice that the dome play area at the front of the school has been fenced off. At spring break, we will have work crews removing the aging play structures and gravel. This area will be levelled and will be the location of our new outdoor structure! Thank you to our EES PAC, SD69, and the Parksville Rotary Club for working together to provide funds to build this outdoor learning and gathering area!

Work crews are planning to remove all the gravel from around the "Rainbow Playground". The gravel will be replaced by "soft fall" bark mulch, similar to other local playground areas. This will eliminate the amount of gravel that spills onto the walkways in that area.

Later in the spring, we look forward to the resurfacing of our field area. We now have a second water source that will be hooked up to provide the necessary irrigation to keep our field in better condition. We will also be installing stairs to the field, which will provide a safer access point.

Washroom Etiquette



Once again, we are noticing that the student washrooms are getting very messy each day. Toilets aren't flushed, urine is often on the floor in front of the boys' urinal, there are things in the toilets that should not be there (food and food wrappers, pens/pencils, etc.), there have been cases where graffiti has been written on the walls, and we've had crumpled and wet paper towels on the ceiling and walls. This has caused plumbing issues and as we have had to close washroom stalls down during the day for cleaning, it reduces the number of toilets available for student use throughout the day. It also causes additional time to clean in the evenings when the custodial staff should be concentrating on cleaning the rest of the school properly. We are very concerned about the state of the washrooms and have been monitoring them throughout the day. We hope that you will help by reminding your children about responsible washroom use and taking care of our place.



We are required to follow the BC Healthy Food and Beverage Guidelines when serving food in schools. If you are wanting to send treats to school to help celebrate a special occasion, please contact your child's teacher in advance to make arrangements. Food must be prepared and packaged in a Food Safe Certified facility.

- Please make sure your child has appropriate clothing and footwear for outdoor use, along with a pair of inside shoes and an extra change of clothes. We also recommend having a warm coat, hat, umbrella, and gloves. We have a good supply of clothing and hand-knit items on hand. Please let us know if your child needs any warm clothing.
- When reporting your child's absence, please call the office at 250-248-8446 (after hours
 you can leave a message on our answering service just listen for the option to report
 a student absence in the directory). It is important to let the office know if your child will
 be late or not attending school for the day(s) so your child is accounted for. It only takes
 a minute. If your child is not at school or late you can expect to receive a call to your
 main number. Thank you in advance for reporting early!
- School begins at 8:10am. If you are dropping off your child prior to 8:10am, please use the Lower Parking Lot. If you are dropping off after 8:10am, you may pull up to the front of the school. Students who arrive after 8:15am must report to the office before going to their classroom.
- Please make sure your child's teacher is aware of your child's after school schedule. We need to know if your child is getting picked up (and by who) or taking the bus.

Student Learning Survey

The Student Learning Survey is for students in Grades 4, 7, 10, and 12, their parents, and staff.

The survey covers a wide range of topics and provides feedback on the implementation of the curriculum changes, learning environment, student wellness and satisfaction, student belonging and engagement, and career preparation. Questions were developed with input from partner groups, teachers and experts in educational measurement and special education. This survey will be administered to our Grade 4 and 7 students in the coming months. Parents of Grade 4 and 7 students are encouraged to complete this survey by clicking on the link below.

Parents may access the survey following the directions and link for **Direct Access** below. Surveys are to be completed by parents with children in Grades 4, 7, 10, and 12. A parent may complete a survey for each child in the targeted grades. The parent survey is available in English, French and 16 other languages. Thank you in advance for your participation. The survey is open until midnight on **April 29, 2023**.

To complete the survey:

- 1. Go to any computer that has an up-to-date internet browser access. Acceptable browsers include Firefox, Internet Explorer, Chrome or Edge.
- 2. Go to <u>www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey/access.htm</u>
- 3. Scroll down to the "Parent" section and select Direct Access no logon number required; then select:
 - District: the name of your child's school district (69 Qualicum)
 - School: the name of your child's school (Errington Elementary)
 - Language: the language of your choice
- 4. Complete the survey by clicking on the appropriate circle to answer each question. Move to the next set of questions by clicking on the right arrow in the bottom right corner of the screen. Click on the left arrow to navigate backwards.
- 5. When you are finished the survey, you will get a message "Thank you for sharing your views".


