Student Information Forms

If you haven't done so already. please remember to fill out and return the student information forms that were sent home in a package a few weeks ago. These are annually updated and are required in order to keep our records current. The package includes a sheet called "Student Verification Form" (white form) and a sheet called "Student Health and Emergency Information" (green form). Even if there are no changes to your child's information, we still need you to **sign** those forms and return to the school as soon as possible.

Emergency Preparedness & Drills

Unforeseen emergencies can strike without warning, often leaving us with minimal time to react to a significant disruption in both our personal lives and our communities. Schools, being prominent gathering places, bear a unique responsibility when it comes to emergency preparedness. Ensuring the safety and well-being of our students and staff, as well as instilling confidence in parents as you entrust your child(ren) to our care. We have started practicing several scenarios with our students including fire, earthquake and lockdown drills so far.

Shelter in Place is used when personal safety is considered to be in danger if anyone leaves the school. It is usually an environmental hazard or wildlife in the vicinity of the school.

- Exterior windows and doors locked.
- Free movement within the building.
- Remain inside until advised that conditions are safe

Lockout (also known as Hold and Secure) is used when it is necessary to secure a school because there is an emergency situation occurring outside the school. The exterior doors are locked and monitored to allow students and staff to enter but otherwise remain locked. Once inside, no one leaves the building.

- Exterior windows and doors locked and monitored.
- Students and staff may enter from outside.
- Classes function as normal.
- Remain inside until advised that conditions are safe

Lockdown is used to prevent intruders from entering occupied areas of a building or when it is necessary to isolate students and staff from danger outside or within the building. Situations include active shooters or dangerous intruders. Staff and students are restricted in their movement.

- Exterior windows and doors locked.
- Everyone inside
- All windows and doors locked.
- Lights off and everybody out of sight and silent.
- Ignore bells.
- Remain inside until advised by authorities that conditions are safe

Canada Dental Benefit for Families

Canada Dental Benefit

Smile! It is here.

Have you heard about the Canada Dental Benefit?

The Canada Dental Benefit is designed to assist families with children under 12 whose adjusted family net income is less than \$90,000, and who do not have access to private dental insurance. This program enables eligible families to receive direct upfront payments of up to \$650 per child during each benefit period to cover oral health services.

The program is now accepting applications for the second benefit period, which aims to alleviate the out-of-pocket expenses related to dental care services incurred between July 1, 2023, and June 30, 2024. This benefit offers crucial financial support, allowing families to begin addressing the basic dental care needs of their young children.
