## Principal's Message

As we reach mid-March, our thoughts turn towards spring break. It will be a good chance to reflect on the year so far, rest and recharge our bodies and minds, and prepare for the spring term. In this newsletter, you will find information about spring conferencing after the break.

We continue our focus on supporting students to become more independent, especially when they face increased challenges. The article below provides some questions to think about:

Do you encourage your child to work independently?

"Mom, I can't do it. I need help!" Every child makes that plea once in a while. But if your child says it every day, you may need to help her become more independent.

Answer yes or no to the questions below to find out if you are fostering self-reliance:

1. **Do you tell** your child that you believe she can do it?
2. **Do you help** her break big projects down into smaller pieces that are easier to finish?
3. **Do you remind** her of the importance of effort? "You couldn't ride a bike the first time you tried. But you kept at it. You'll learn this, too, if you keep at it."
4. **Do you ask** her questions when she gets stuck? "What did you learn when you read the chapter?"
5. **Do you compliment** your child when she finishes work on her own?

How well are you doing? If your answers are yes, you are helping your child learn how to work on her own. For no answers, try those ideas.

## Planning for September

Soon we will begin developing a draft class organization for next school year. This includes projecting student enrolment and creating classes that make the most efficient use of our staff, while at the same time, observing provincial class size limits and building classes that can work together as a team. Attached below is a letter from the Assistant Superintendent regarding class formation for September 2019. If you would like to provide input to your child's placement, please do this by **Thursday, April 18<sup>th</sup>**. Please note that parent input is one of a number of factors that guide us in the formation of classes. We must pay attention to the other important considerations outlined in the letter below, which contribute to an optimum learning environment for all children. While a smaller school such as ours has many benefits, we are also faced with a very limited number of classes at each grade level – which limits placement options.

Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s):

### **RE: CLASS BUILDING FOR 2019-20**

During the next month, staff at our schools will begin the complex process of forming learning groups for the upcoming school year. This work includes projecting student enrollment and creating classes that make the most effective use of our staff and most importantly, building balanced student groupings that can work together cohesively as learning communities. This is a challenging task as there are many factors that must be taken into consideration including:

- Social and emotional dynamics
- Academic strengths and needs
- Unique learning needs
- Class size goals

Staff take this work very seriously and collaborate extensively in order to make the best decisions about student placement. We strive to shape classes which will support the learning needs of **all** students.

There are many unknowns as we begin this task. For example:

- We are not sure who all of the teachers will be at our schools next year as the annual staffing process is not completed until late June
- Some staff members may request, or be asked, to change their assignment for next year
- We are never completely clear about our enrollment until early September and so learner groupings must remain somewhat fluid

As a result, the learner groupings that we create in spring are tentative and are not finalized until early in the new school year. For this reason, class groupings will be kept confidential until they are finalized in September.

If you would like to provide staff at your child's school with input into their placement for next year, we encourage you to:

1. Talk to your child's current classroom teacher about your interests, and then;
2. Send a note to the school principal outlining what you see as your child's learning needs, preferred learning style or any other information you think might be relevant as staff work through the task of shaping learning environments for the upcoming year.

We ask that you do not request a specific teacher. Your input will be considered along with the other complex variables that go into constructing a class; however, not all recommendations can be honoured.

The deadline for submitting information regarding your child's class placement is **Thursday, April 18, 2019**.

## Celebration of Learning/Spring Conferencing

Communicating student learning is an essential part of education. EES Teachers are planning an opportunity to connect with families during the week of May 1st. Some teachers are planning a "celebration of learning", some will be setting up individual conference times, and some are planning a combination of both. The survey covers a range of topics, providing a comprehensive picture of the educational experience in B.C. public schools. Questions were developed with input from partner groups, teachers and experts in educational measurement and special education. This survey will be administered to our Grade 4 and 7 students during April. Parents of Grade 4 and 7 students are encouraged to complete this survey by clicking on the link below.

## New Parking Lot Reminders

We monitor student attendance closely and during this time of year, illness is common. We would like to remind you that if your child shows signs of a communicable infection, it needs to be diagnosed and treated by a medical provider. Please contact us at the school if your child has a communicable infection so that we can work with you on determining if and how long your child needs to be absent from school. We use a guide provided by Island Health to help us prevent the spread of common childhood illnesses. When calling in your child's absence, we also appreciate knowing what kind of illness is causing them to be away. We track patterns and are required to report to Island Health if there is an unusual number of absences due to illness.





The book draw took place this week! Congratulations to all of our winners – we had 332 entries and 60 of them came from Room 10 – well done!

## VIU STUDENTS BRIGHTEN CHILDREN'S SMILES

**SUMMARY: VIU's Dental Hygiene and Child and Youth Care students team up to provide free teeth cleanings for low income families.**

NANAIMO, BC: "If the children walk away with a smile on their face, we know we've done a good job," says Connor Edwards, a fourth-year student in Vancouver Island University's (VIU's) [Child and Youth Care](#) (CYC) program.

The CYC and [Dental Hygiene](#) programs have teamed up to organize the Healthy Kids Dental Clinic – a free or by-donation dental check-up service for low-income families.

"We started three years ago after having community discussions on how we can better serve families in the area," says Teri Derksen, VIU CYC Professor.

Healthy Kids is a community initiative created by the CYC's [Centre for Community Outreach and Care](#), which focuses on social justice-inspired activities to support children and families in the Harewood area. Third-year students advertise the program by reaching out to schools and through social media and coordinate appointments, while the dental hygiene students perform the dental work for the children.

"Routine dental care isn't financially accessible to everyone – especially for families without extended health-care plans – so having this service at the university is invaluable to us," says a mother of three children accessing the clinic, who asked to remain anonymous. "The students take the time to get the kids comfortable and make it really fun for them."

The clinic operates on a scheduled Saturday every year and sees about 30 children throughout the day. Dr. Alex Chen volunteers as the in-house dentist and 18 dental hygiene students in both first and second year provide teeth cleanings, X-rays and oral hygiene training to patients.

"This is a great opportunity for us to practice our dental skills while working with younger patients," says Jaime Wagner, second-year Dental Hygiene student. "Our main focus is to make this a fun, memorable experience for the children so they continue to take care of their oral health throughout their life."

## **2019 Spring Season Registration Open!**

**It is that time of the year again...dust off those gloves and get ready to hit the fields! Registration is now open online at [www.oceansidebaseball.ca](http://www.oceansidebaseball.ca)...just click on Register to the left.**

**Registration closes March 31st. Any registration received later than March 31 will be processed with a \$20.00 fee increase.**

**So, register now to receive the early bird fees!**

A few common questions we receive during registration time...

### ***1. How can I pay if I don't have a credit card or a PayPal account?***

Arrangements for payment by cash or cheque can be made by contacting the registrar. **Please note a player's registration is not complete until payment is received in full.**

### ***2. What fields do we play at?***

Tadpole, Rookie, and Blastball play at the Qualicum Park on the fields that run on First Ave. and Mosquito, Pee Wee, Bantam, and Midget play at Springwood Park. Field addresses can be found by clicking on the Fields tab to the left.

### ***3. When does the season start and end? What days do they play?***

The season begins at the beginning of April and runs through to the end of June. Blastball (for the month of May only) and Rookie are Mondays and Wednesdays at Qualicum.

Tadpole is Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays at Qualicum.

Mosquito is Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays at Springwood.

Pee Wee is Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays at Springwood.

Bantam weekdays TBA, and Saturdays at Springwood. Away games TBA.

Midget weekdays TBA, and Sundays at Springwood. Away games TBA.

**Please note schedules are finalized by the division coordinators and based on field availability.**

(Summer seasons for players who make rep teams run through the month of July, with Provincials Championships often on the August long weekend.)

### ***4. Can I register my child for a division that is not their age group by year born?***

All players must register in the correct age group. A request can be sent to OMBA to make a move for a player, however each request is reviewed individually, and decisions are based on space in the divisions, the players skill level and whether it is safe to make the switch. Requests must be sent to the board for review and players will be invited to evaluations. All requests are sent to and will require the final approval of BC Minor.

### ***5. I haven't heard from anyone, when will we be contacted?***

Coordinators will receive information on player registration over the next couple of months. Usually initial contact with parents will occur by email mid-March to the end of March with information on start dates and evaluation times.

If you have any questions for your child's division coordinator you can contact them directly. Click on the Contacts tab to the left and send them an email.


