Descriptive feedback for all students (K-12)

Descriptive feedback includes strengths-based, written comments or documented conversation that are aligned to the provincial Learning Standards and describe student learning, as well as identify specific areas for future growth. A strengths-based approach recognizes that student learning is dynamic and holistic, and that students demonstrate their learning in different ways and at different rates. Feedback is focused on what the student can do and what they are working toward.

Feedback will also be given on attendance, areas of growth and opportunities for development through a combination of student self-assessment of the Core Competencies, goal setting and descriptive feedback.
