IMPORTANT BUSSING UPDATE

Affecting AM and PM routes: 1,2,3,5,12,13,14,15,20 and 21

The Qualicum School District Transportation Department is making multiple adjustments to bus routes to accommodate hundreds of late applications for bussing. These changes will take effect for the morning run on Wednesday September 10th, 2025.

We appreciate your patience as we adapt to serve districts families this year.



CAREER CENTRE OPPORTUNITIES

Work Experience Program (Grades 10–12)

Did you know your student can earn high school credits for their part-time job or volunteer work? Students in Grades 10, 11, or 12 can receive **elective credits** through the Work Experience Program.

To participate, students must:

- Log a minimum of 100 work hours
- Complete a short work experience assignment

If your student is already working or planning to work, encourage them to visit the Career Centre to pick up the first Work Experience Package which needs to be filled out before they register for the program.

Bonus Incentive:

Students who return their completed package **before September 26th** will be **entered into a draw** to win a **pizza lunch for themselves and their friends!**

Welcome to Artona!

Here are some important things to know for the upcoming school year, with regards to fall photography.

Photo Day: Your school can provide you more details on your upcoming Photo Day and Retake Day, please check their website or ask your child. You can also find it on our web page, using one of the search bars on our homepage and entering your child's school name at the bottom of the page. <https://artona.com>

Within 48 business hours of Photo Day, your child's digital proof(s) will be available to view on our website.

If you know the school name, student last name, and student number, you will have no issues accessing and viewing the digital proof. If your child brought home the Photo Day card with a QR code/number on it, you can also use that to access your child's photo proof. If you still have problems, please contact our customer service team for further assistance.

To receive free shipping to the school, photo packages must be ordered within 1 week of Photo Day. Approximately 2 weeks after the ordering cut-off date, the photos will arrive at the school.

Retake Day: If your student requires a retake, the retake photo will become the photo used for all services (ID card, photo directory, etc) at the school. For example, it would become the yearbook image, if the school has a yearbook, or perhaps it's used for an ID card. Both photos will remain active for you to order online on our website.

For students issued an ID card, they must return the ID card on Retake Day and a new one will be issued in approximately one week. For students not receiving ID cards, please send students back to school with their original QR card if possible. A new camera card can be issued at the camera, however, those with cards will be prioritized.

Retake Days follow the same production, ordering and shipping timelines as original Photo Day.

If you miss the cut off for free shipping from original Photo Day, your photo packages are held and shipped to the school with the retake packages, at no cost to you.

There are other options to receive photos:

1. Digital Download. If you order digital images of your child's photo, a high-resolution, digital version of the image(s) selected will be sent to you, generally the same day. There is no additional cost for this service other than the cost of what you have chosen.

2. Ship to home. If you miss the Original and Retake Day cutoff for complimentary shipping to the school, you still have the opportunity to purchase a package and pay the small shipping fee to have the packages delivered directly to you.

Artona maintains its studio and office in Vancouver BC. Appointments can be booked there if you are on the mainland with advanced booking. See our website for more details.

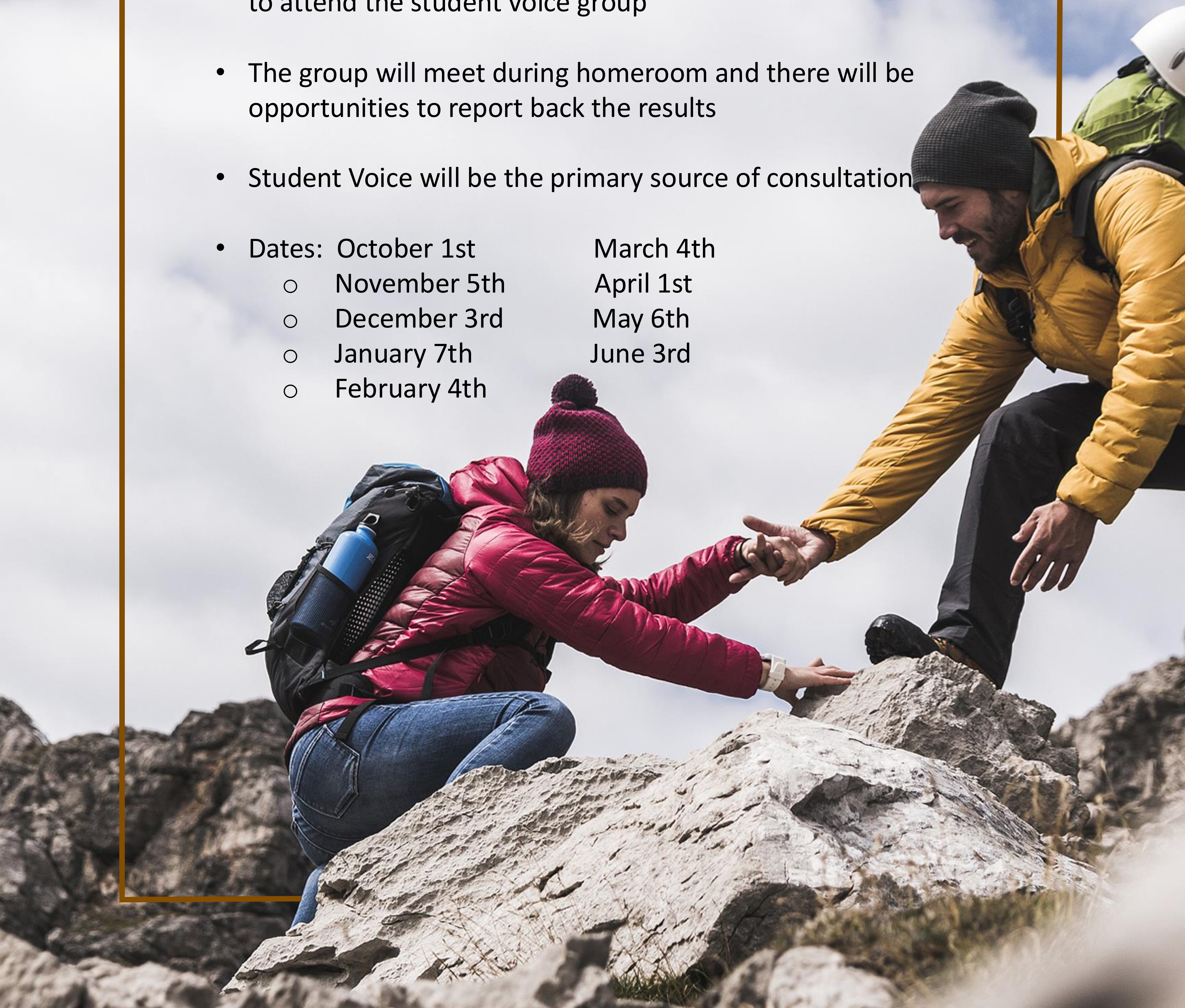

<div>AT A GLANCE</div>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> PAC is the official voice of parents for formal participation in school affairs. If you have a child at KSS, you are part of the PAC. The PAC executive ensures that parents’ interests are represented and that good communication between home & school is maintained. The PAC meets once per month in the KSS Library.
<div>VOLUNTEER</div>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> DPAC REPS: attend the monthly DPAC meeting, report back to the PAC, seek input from the PAC (can be split if we get two reps). The position requires approximately 4-6 hours per month, depending on the person(s). TREASURER (transitional position): work alongside our current treasurer to learn the ropes or take over completely – with access to her expertise as needed (can be a shared position if enough interest). Requires approximately 10-15 hours per month. VICE CHAIR: take over for Chair in their absence, extra duties as required and as availability allows. This position would require a minimum of 4 hours per month.

Quick Start for Students and Parents

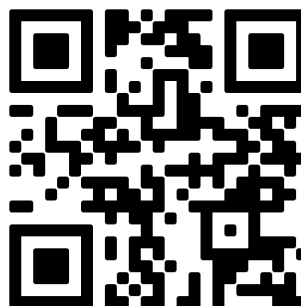

1. Download the app

You can find the app - **it's free to download!** - on the App Store (iOS) or Google Play (Android) by

- Searching in the store for “My School Day”
- Going to <https://myschoolday.app/download> in the browser on your phone
- Using the QR code at right.



Make sure to allow it to receive notifications when asked - the school will use them to send out important reminders, information and alerts.

2. Select your school

The first time you start the app you will need to select your school. Choose a province, school district, and finally your school from the lists provided, and tap “confirm”. *This only needs to be done once.*

3. Follow channels.

Channels let the school administration and teachers send out information specific to your classes and activities, so you get only those notifications for your classes and those of interest to the entire school. To subscribe to channels:

- Tap on the “Classes” icon
- Tap “Follow Channels” in the menu
- Tap the checkboxes for the channels you are interested in
- Tap on the “Done” button.

Remember to check back regularly for new channels that your teachers may have added.



4. Enter your classes

Tapping on the classes icon also gives you an option to set up your timetable. Select that option and enter your class names and select colours and icons. You can also enter morning, lunch, and after school activities. When you tap on “Done”, the app will fill in your timetable.

5. Access school information, links and files

The school and teachers will add links and files that provide resources to the school community such as course materials for remote learning, health advisories, and other school, district, and provincial information. To access these school-wide and channel-specific resources:
