We enter December with a breath of fresh island air and morning mist glistening on the treetops. With the days being at their shortest and the holiday season soon upon us, we continue to reflect on the natural beauty of the seasonal changes in this beautiful place we call home – the unceded territory of the Qualicum First Nation.

During the professional development day on November 24th, staff participated in a facilitated discussion on trauma informed practice and had a shared experience in place-based learning. We recognized one staff member who has been with the district for 10 years, Ms. Dallas Ruff, and we collaborated within departments on priority items that continue to help guide us towards meeting our school and district goals.

Student learning updates went home on November 20th and students on track for honour roll or principal's list were recognized with a stamp on their reports for their efforts. Keep up the good work!

We are continuing to track attendance and will be reaching out to individuals concerning attendance patterns next week.

Student voice held its third meeting on December 3rd and students were provided with some follow-up and updates on the previous agenda items. Looking ahead, we will continue to discuss items of importance to them, including enhancing school spirit and student activities.

During Homeroom this week, students and staff walked through the importance of looking after each other and being a good community member. The Hulqiminum term used to explain this best is 'Xwiyu' los' tel. Students were then given the opportunity to write holiday cards for local seniors or organizations of their choosing. Free Bagels, fruit and yoghurt served in the Kondor Kitchen.




