September 30 marked the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The day is marked by the wearing of orange shirts, inspired by the story of Phyllis Webstad, whose orange shirt was taken on her first day of residential school. The traumatic experience symbolic of the loss of culture and identity that Indigenous students faced in residential schools. The day is a day to listen and to reflect and we as a staff had the opportunity to do just that on our September 29th Professional Development Day. We looked at the importance of language and listened to local stories, many of which were being shared for the first time. It is an example of the work being done to walk the path forward together.

There are lots of things happening around the school which we continue to be excited about. Seminar had a great introduction and as students get more familiar with the process, we are excited to see what great learning comes out of them. The cops for cancer came for their annual visit and the school presented them with a cheque for \$5474.80. Thanks to leadership students for heading this up again and for the entire community for their contributions. On Wednesday we held a ribbon cutting ceremony for our newly renovated washrooms. They look fantastic!


