





 - In-school and out-of-school experiences
- Career Life Plan
- Capstone Project (completed in grade 12)

CAREER LIFE CONNECTIONS

- For those CLC 11 students who have not already submitted your Grad Transition Plan, please do so.
- The deadline for this is March 7th.
- This will help us during the Grad Transition Meetings that will be taking place after Spring Break. During your Grad Transition Meeting, we will ensure your selected courses for grade 12 meet the prerequisites for your after graduation plan.

CAPSTONE PROJECT

- A culminating project or experience, or senior exhibition, that allows students to demonstrate their learning using an area(s) of interest as the basis for the project.
- Ideally, an area you are passionate about and something you might pursue after graduation.
- Students will design, assemble, and present a capstone project to an audience to demonstrate personal learning and achievement (in and out-of-school), growth in the core competencies, and a reflection on the post-graduation plan.

DISTRICT/SCHOOL BASED PROGRAMS

- ROAMS 1 (Rivers, Oceans & Mountains School)
 - Semester 2; no in-school classes
 - Can get the equivalent of 7 courses (28 credits)
- ROAMS 2 (Global ROAMS)
 - Semester 2 @ KSS
 - ½ academic (BC First Peoples 12 & Environmental Science 11)
 - ½ outdoor education, leadership and cultural interactions

These programs have an application form & fees; consultation with parent is required. Limited spaces available.

HEAD STARTDUAL CREDIT WORK EXPERIENCE

Head Start/Dual Credit

- Did you know that you can take a trade or other post-secondary program (including university courses) while in high school
- Receive grade 12 course credits as well as post-secondary credits

Work Experience

- Do you currently have a job or plan on getting a job?
- You can get 8 credits towards graduation with your job!

POST-SECONDARY PLANNING

- Every post-secondary institution has its own specific entrance requirements
- It is your job to research the post-secondary institution and specific programs of interest
- A second language (gr. 11 level) is required for direct entry to both UBC - Vancouver & SFU
- All Vancouver Island schools (UVIC, VIU, NIC, Camosun) don't require a second language requirement.
- Take advantage of every opportunity in regards to postsecondary &/or career exploration

 - Most programs required Grade 12 graduation with specific Grade 11 and Grade 12 subjects (Language Arts & Mathematics)
 - Grade 12 is the minimum entrance requirement for some programs

- Regional Colleges or Universities (ex. VIU or North Island College)
 - Grade 12 graduation with a minimum "C" in English 12 ('C+ is recommended)
 - Depends upon specific entrance requirements of a program
 - Need to research the program on the institution's website

ADMISSION REQUIREMENT CHANGES

- Several universities are now looking at grade 11 & 12 courses (UBC, SFU) when calculating GPA
- Many universities have supplemental applications (personal profiles) for direct entry into specific programs
- UBC is now expecting students to have six grade 12 courses (including English 12) & a "3" on your Lit. 12 Assessment
- SFU is now looking at five grade 12 academic courses (including English 12)
- Admission requirements change so you need to do your research.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

- All of your marks in grade 11 & 12 subjects go towards scholarship eligibility.
- Our community typically awards upwards of \$75,000+ to our graduating students.
- Scholarships are divided between academic areas and trades & technology areas.
- Post-Secondary Preparation 12 Course (outside TT)

COURSE SELECTION PROCESS

- Grade Presentations (Planning sheet and course guide)
- Online course selections will be next week!
- Online submission of courses due Tuesday March 11th
- Grade 11's: You must select a minimum of 8 courses
- Grade 12's: You must select a minimum of 6 & 2 study blocks courses
- Provide a minimum of two (2) alternates (these <u>must be different from your first choices</u>)
- Grade 11's do not get study blocks.
