

English Language Arts English 9	MEN--09	Grade 9 Credits 0
The study of English will involve all forms of written and oral communication. Speaking, listening and writing skills will be developed throughout the semester using a variety of media. A wide range of fiction, non-fiction, drama and poetry will be studied. Opportunities for individual student initiative in written communication will be provided to ensure maximum development of each students interests and strengths.		
English Language Arts Composition 10	MCMPS10	Grade 10 Credits 2
The English 10 curriculum focuses on the development of skills introduced in English 9. A wide range of literary material will be used in this study. The writing focus for this course is the multi-paragraph expository essay.		
English Language Arts Composition 10- Distance Learning (CEAP)	MCMPS10DL	Grade 10 Credits 2
This course is a distance learning course offered through CEAP. Students need to be self-directed learners who are organized and have good time management skills in order to be successful with a distance learning course. The English 10 curriculum focuses on the development of skills introduced in English 9. A wide range of literary material will be used in this study. The writing focus for this course is the multi-paragraph expository essay.		
English Language Arts Creative Writing 10- Distance Learning (CEAP)	MCTWR10DL	Grade 10 Credits 2
Distance Learning Course— Creative Writing 10 is designed for students who have an interest in creative expression through language. The course provides students opportunities to build their writing skills through the exploration of identity, memory, and story in a range of genres. Within a supportive community of writers, students will collaborate and develop their skills through writing and design processes. This course is intentionally grounded in the sampling of writing processes, inviting students to express themselves creatively as they experiment with, reflect on, and practice their writing.		
English Language Arts Literary Studies 10	MLTST10	Grade 10 Credits 2
Literary Studies 10 is designed for students who are interested in the literature of a particular era, geographical area, or theme, or in the study of literature in general. The course allows students to delve more deeply into literature as they explore specific themes, periods, authors, or areas of the world through literary works in a variety of media. Giving students the choice of a range of literary topics allows them to follow their passion and at the same time: - increase their literacy skills through close reading of appropriately challenging texts - enhance their development of the English Language Arts curricular competencies, both expressive and receptive - expand their development as educated global citizens - develop balance and broaden their understanding of themselves and the world - develop higher-level thinking and learning skills.		
English Language Arts Composition 11- Distance Learning (CEAP)	MCMPS11DL	Grade 11 Credits 4
Composition 11 is designed to support students as they refine, clarify, and adjust their written communication through practice and revision. Students will read and study compositions by other writers and be exposed to a variety of styles as models for the development of their writing. The course provides opportunities for students to, with increasing independence, study, create, and write original and authentic pieces for a range of purposes and real-world audiences. They will expand their competencies through processes of drafting, reflecting, and revising to build a body of work that demonstrates expanding breadth, depth, and evidence of writing for a range of situations. They will develop confidence in their abilities as they consolidate their writing craft. The following are possible areas of focus within Composition 11: narrative, expository, descriptive, persuasive, and opinion piece, planning, drafting, and editing processes, writing for specific audiences and specific disciplines, how to cite sources, consider the credibility of evidence, and evaluate the quality and reliability of the source.

<p>English Language Arts Creative Writing 12</p> <p>Creative Writing 12 is designed for students who are interested in creating a body of work reflective of a sophisticated breadth and depth of skill. The course provides students with opportunities to specialize and publish in real-world contexts. Students engage in the exploration of personal and cultural identities, memories, and stories, in a wide range of genres. Within a supportive community, students will collaborate and develop their skills through writing and design processes, celebrating successes. Students will refine their ability to write in complex, controlled styles with effectiveness and impact. The following are possible areas of focus within Creative Writing 12: fiction and poetry suggested content includes flash fiction, graffiti, sub-genres (e.g., adventure, children's literature, comic/graphic, fantasy, fan fiction, historical fiction, horror, sci-fi, dystopian, suspense, thriller, tragedy, romance), drama, script writing, poetry, authenticity versus sentimentality, literary devices and techniques, various forms, the relationship between form and function, creative non-fiction. Suggested content includes columns, features, articles, queries, captions, layout, reporting, interviews, reviews (fashion, movie), advertising, titles, bylines, sample readings memoir suggested content includes place-based writing, narrative, film memoir, sample readings.</p>	MCTWR12	Grade 11 12 Credits 4

Composition 12 is designed to support students in their refinement and pursuit of mastery of written communication as they prepare to move to academic post-secondary studies. Students will read and study exemplary compositions by other writers and be exposed to a variety of styles as models for the development of their writing. The course provides opportunities for students, with increasing independence and self-sufficiency, to study, create, and write original and authentic pieces for a range of purposes and audiences using real-world applications with impact and effectiveness. They will develop their craft through processes of drafting, reflecting, and revising to build a body of publishable work that demonstrates breadth, depth, and evidence of sophisticated and specialized writing for a range of situations: narrative, expository, descriptive, persuasive, and opinion pieces, with attention to areas such as thesis development, structure, transitions, hooks and leads, persuasion, argumentation, and the study of a wide range of sample works. Students will work on: planning, drafting, and editing processes; writing for specific professional audiences and specific academic disciplines; how to cite sources, consider the credibility of evidence, and evaluate the quality and reliability of the source.

English Language Arts English Studies 12

This required English Studies 12 course builds on and extends students previous learning experiences in English 10 and 11 courses. It is designed for all students and provides them with opportunities to: refine their ability to communicate effectively in a variety of contexts and to achieve their personal and career goals; think critically and creatively about the uses of language; explore texts from a variety of sources in multiple modes, and that reflect diverse worldviews; deepen their understanding of themselves and others in a changing world; gain insight into the diverse factors that shape identity, appreciate the importance of self-representation through text; contribute to Reconciliation by building greater understanding of the knowledge and perspectives of First Peoples; expand their understanding of what it means to be educated Canadian and global citizens.
